The company runs the Centre for Psychoanalysis. The Centre provides:

- 1. Accessible, in-depth psychological treatment (psychoanalysis and psychoanalytic psychotherapy) to the local community for adults, families, children and young people.
- Intensive training for those who want to become psychoanalysts and training in
 psychological treatment for people locally, especially staff working in local mental and
 physical health services (South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust, King's
 College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and
 Neuroscience).
- 3. Support and training for staff working with people with serious mental illness and their families.

During the year the Centre's activities continued to benefit the local community in the following ways:

- Access for local people to psychotherapy and psychoanalysis with low fee assessments and treatment available to those in need.
- Access for local psychoanalysts and psychotherapists to rooms in which they can offer psychotherapeutic treatment to the local South London community. (There is a lack of settings in South London)
- Education and training programmes for local mental and physical health staff, therapists and other members of the local community: lectures and clinical discussion groups including the Maudsley Lectures in Psychoanalysis, Child Analysis Clinical Seminars, Psychoanalytic Film Club, and Psychosomatics Workshops.
- Parent infant therapeutic playgroup for refugee and asylum seeking families: enabling parents in the local community to have psychotherapeutic help with their interactions with their infants.

The CIC's stakeholders are:

- The local community; residents of the boroughs of Southwark and Lambeth in London who are suffering psychologically.
- Staff working within the local mental and physical health services: South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust, King's College Hospital Foundation Trust, Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and Neuroscience.

The Directors and members of the Board and Advisory Group live and work in the local community. This Centre has arisen out of their experience and finding out about the experience of mental health users, colleagues and other members of the community.

We originally consulted people interested in training in intensive psychological treatment with the Institute of Psychoanalysis and found a building on a site that is accessible for those working at the Maudsley or in South London. We furnished the building taking into account feedback from our stakeholders. We continue to run the building and adapt to regular feedback from the trainees working onsite. This year we also started two new continuing professional development groups, after recently qualified trainee therapists and individuals who completed other educational courses in intensive psychological treatments, expressed a wish to have further opportunities for discussions and reading groups.

The local community were consulted by leafleting playgroups, nurseries, GP surgeries etc about the need for parent and toddler groups and it was made clear this is particularly required for the demographic of refugee and asylum-seeking families. This year, the team running the therapeutic playgroup for refugee families made links with and canvassed other local services supporting the refugee community, to better understand what support the families needed and where this could be found. We have appointed a new Outreach Worker who will specifically focus on links between the service users of the therapeutic playgroup for refugees and other services available to support them.
