Dormant Status for the Year ended 30/04/2019. The activities of the Company encompass the objectives and plans described below;

- 1. As Director of 3ESAG, I am a UK resident but of Malawi origin in Central Africa.
  - 3ESAG CIC's intentions are to operate by servicing communities locally and in Malawi to build sustainable economy that will build stable self-financing and income generating schemes. To 'Equip and Empower' locals as a community; via free access to and/or affordable services offered by 3ESAG CIC. They in turn can empower forwards. The domino effect should create a spiral empowerment outreach programme.
- 2. Specific activities will comprise, to mention but a few:
  - a. Mentoring to equip people with skills in my areas of expertise and others that can be outsourced. Mentorship will be offered at Nominal fee to show commitment or at Zero fee, dependent on client circumstances. This programme will run in cohorts. The service will be offered on voluntary basis from 3ESAG CIC Director and through Strategic Alliances.
  - b. Offering project and business management services at nominal fee or Zero fee, dependent on client needs. This will enable clients stand on their own without financial demands before they businesses develop past introduction stage into a profitable phase.
  - c. 'Information, Resources & Research Bank' on health and psychological well-being. Initial focus will be on a women's health outreach to offer knowledge gained from exposure in the western world and research done on various fronts in different capacities as patient, carer, employee or mediator in some settings.
  - d. Then progress into chronic illness management and support, disability awareness and mental health issues with links to expert advice as necessary through strategic alliances. Many people die prematurely in emerging economies; the so-called The 3rd World due to lack of knowledge and limited or absence of facilities.
  - e. \*\*Supporting The Prison Services in the capacity of Independent Monitoring facility for and in behalf of the relevant Government Ministry to assess and ensure fair and humane treatment, based on a UK BEST PRACTICE BENCHMARKING MODEL. This is yet to be validated for access through relevant authorities current work in progress.
- 3. Community Benefit

The community will benefit from having participants accessing increased opportunities to fulfil their potential and thus be effectively engaged in sustainable jobs and fully integrated into the wider community to assist in the growth of the local economies. The community will benefit by accessing services, facilities and products at a nominal or 'zero fee for a specified limited time', without spending as 3ESAG will provide some services voluntarily. As such, entrepreneurs trying to set income generating schemes will be able to reach a break even position quicker. Expertise to be transferred will help with knowledge and skills."

4. Socio-Economic Impact Objective

The intent is to create awareness of problems that people may face; means they open up to finding solutions. 3ESAG will bridge a gap as an enabler to building bridges.

Once existent challenges are acknowledged, treatment options can be weighed and availed from appropriate providers. 3ESAG will only offer support in gaining knowledge and sign-post the community to the right facilities.

On the back of this, a short term plan is to link up and liaise with medical equipment suppliers and/or hospitals - to request for a provision and release of dilapidated equipment which can be revamped to then be sent to Africa - Malawi in the first instance as the Director's home of origin - so as to trial effectiveness of services on the ground. Scrapped machinery in UK and Europe can save lives in Africa/ Asia or other emerging economies. The people are enterprising and innovative in creating self-help products through projects. 3ESAG will endeavour to be a link with providers of such equipment that hospitals cannot access due to financial constraints. If refurbished, dilapidated equipment can save lives where people life below par. It will be good enough in comparison to 'no access'. Standards of living in Malawi and various emerging economies Africa/ Asia etc., are poor due to high levels of poverty; and a wide gap between low income earners and those in higher income bracket. 3ESAG will focus on communities in the low income bracket who cannot afford private healthcare.
