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Notes to the Financial Statements

Period from 10 May 2018 to 31 May 2019

1. General information

The company is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 10 Lower James Street, London, W1F 9EL. The principal activity of the company was the provision of research, analytical and support services.

2. Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Section 1A of FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', and the Companies Act 2006.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity and rounded to the nearest £. The significant accounting policies consistently applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below.

Going concern

The company has net liabilities of £703,457 at the year end. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the shareholders have indicated their willingness to support the company for the foreseeable future.

Foreign currencies

Foreign currency transactions are initially recorded in the functional currency, by applying the spot exchange rate as at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate ruling at the reporting date, with any gains or losses being taken to the profit and loss account.

Operating leases

Lease payments are recognised as an expense over the lease term on a straight-line basis. The aggregate benefit of lease incentives is recognised as a reduction to expense over the lease term, on a straight-line basis.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and are subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses.

Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful life of that asset as follows:

12. Directors' advances, credits and guarantees

During the period, the directors made advances of £1,265,270 and this was outstanding at the end of the period. This contains a loan totalling £1,250,000 which is unsecured, and interest free. £1,000,000 is repayable by August 2028 and £250,000 is repayable by March 2029. The remaining balance of the director's loan account is unsecured, interest free and repayable on demand.
