Billy & Andy's Music School has continued its mission to address social isolation among individuals with profound and multiple disabilities (PMLD) through music-based activities. Throughout the financial year, we have organised weekly "living room gigs" at residential homes catering to individuals with PMLD, providing them with meaningful and engaging musical experiences.

Our daily holiday music schools, conducted outside of term time, have seen a surge in participation, thanks to funding that allowed us to expand our staff, making the sessions more accessible and enjoyable for all. This funding support has been made possible by Awards for All.

Furthermore, we are proud to have completed two significant projects: AMPS & RAMPS, generously funded by Youth Music. This initiative involved collaborating with three bands of young disabled musicians, including those with PMLD, who showcased their talents in front of a crowd of nearly 300 people at Projekts Mcr, a local skatepark. To make this event successful, we partnered with the Hard Rock Cafe, who provided volunteer staff members. Additionally, we collaborated with Venture Arts, a local disabled arts charity, and Under One Roof, disabled club night promoters.

In addition to these projects, we initiated music classes for students at several new SEN/D schools in the South Manchester area, ensuring inclusivity and accessibility for all participants, including those with profound and multiple disabilities.
