

Social Audit Report 1 August 2022 to 31 July 2023

General description of the company's activities and impact

Bearwood Community Hub CIC was established on 12 July 2018 following the successful completion of a coworking and creche pilot led by residents in Bearwood, Sandwell, and a community day which invited local residents to explore ideas for setting up a community hub on Bearwood's high street, Bearwood Road.

Mission: To consistently enable every person in Bearwood and surrounding areas to connect, collaborate and create in ways that are right and beneficial for them, and in ways that foster belonging and self-determination.

Vision: An open-to-all community hub sustained by a welcoming and happy, productive and professional workspace for commuters, homeworkers and business owners. A place where everyone can connect, create and collaborate.

Strategic progress

Another very successful HAF playscheme was delivered at the start of our financial year, offering places to 50 children eligible for free school meals. As usual the feedback was very positive, and the playscheme enabled us to make many important links with local parents and their children, as well as artist practitioners and the HAF funders.

After one year at St Mary's Church, Bearwood, where Bearwood Community Hub started to build a successful subletting business (offices, workspace and venue hire) we were told in early September that we would be required to vacate the premises by the end of October 2022. We decided to continue the bakery at St Mary's, with support of the church, but started looking elsewhere for venues. In terms of our strategic positioning within the community, this difficult period of time was also a time of growth. The local community rallied and opened up their spaces. We undertook a lease at Bearwood Yoga for our coworking space and as our main office base, and began a long term positive relationship with Bearwood Baptist Church, where our new, weekly, Wednesday Warm Welcome proved exceptionally popular, with an average of 80 people and up to 100 through the doors each week. Bear Bookshop welcomed us every Monday for our Stay & Play.

In March 2023 we were successful in gaining funding for two years from the National Lottery Community Fund - a huge step forward for our organisation, which gave us the ability to employee the staff that we needed and to pay venue hire to ensure we had a spaces from which to deliver our services and events.

Focus of activities

Our Wednesday Warm Welcome has gone from strength to strength, as has our volunteer pool of 30 volunteers, many with lived experience of the challenges that we try to alleviate - such as poverty, poor housing, migration and discrimination. Our evaluation can be found at www.bearwood.cc/impact.

Our regular activities (mostly weekly) are:

- Wednesday Warm Welcome
- ESOL Classes
- Bring Your Own Art Club
- Community Lunch
- Sewing Club
- Free Shop
- Stay & Play
- Holiday playschemes for children on free school meals
- Individualized support, referrals and signposting for those in crisis (food, income, housing, mental health, physical health)
- Bearwood Community Bakery refugee project
- Listening Ear service
- Coworking 5 days per week

We have enabled or led a number of arts events, bringing high quality professional arts and artists to our neighbourhood. These include:

- We are a Black Country Touring 'Community Promoter', having now hosted a number of professional touring shows
- Shakespeare in Smethwick was a partnership with the Everything to Everybody Project we worked with the University of Birmingham to bring Shakespeare's First Folio to
 Smethwick, and build a varied arts and activity programme around it attracting over 400
 people.

Consultation with stakeholders

The CIC's stakeholders are all members of the community who all live, work or visit in Bearwood. Information on funding news and development plans were shared online during this financial year, as per the previous year.

We continued with our everyday approach of listening to participants' viewpoints and suggestions, acting upon suggestions, and inviting all who wish to collaborate to do so. A number of activities were enabled by us but suggested and led by our stakeholders, including the weekly activities such as Free Shop, Community Lunch, ESOL class (volunteer led) and Bring Your Own Art Club.
