#### Principal activities and business review

The principal activity of the company is that of an events company within the News Corp Investments UK & Ireland group ("News UK" group).

No eyents were run in the year.

#### Future developments

The directors expect the company to continue as an events company within the News UK group for the foresecable future.

#### Principal risks and uncertainties

The company's volume of events and attendance at those events are the key variables whose fluctuations can have a material effect on its operating results and cash flows. The events were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic which caused cancellation and postponement of events however this is expected to be less of an impact going forward.

The company has no trade debtors, with other companies within the News UK group collecting events revenue on behalf of the company. Bad debts associated with events are recharged to the company. This risk is minimised through the use of credit checks and having contractual agreements in place.

The majority of the company's transactions are in sterling, and exposure to fluctuations in foreign currency exchange rates is therefore limited. Foreign currency is managed centrally by the News UK group, which takes into account the foreign currency transactions of the company.

# Directors' Report For the year ended 3 July 2022

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the period ended 3 July 2022.

#### Results and dividends

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £1,191,000 (2021 - profit of £1,979,000).

The directors do not recommend a dividend (2021 - £Nil).

#### Directors of the company

The directors who held office during the year were as follows:

Except as noted above, all directors served throughout the year and are still directors at the date of this report.

The Articles of Association do not require directors to retire either by rotation or in the year of appointment.

#### Directors' indemnity provision

News Corporation has indemnified all directors of the company against liability in respect of proceedings brought by third parties, except that, in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, no indemnity is provided against: any liability incurred by the director in defending civil proceedings brought by the company, or an associated company, in which the final judgement is given against the director; and liability of the director to pay a fine imposed by criminal proceedings; any liability incurred by the director in defending criminal proceedings in which the director is convicted; any liability of the director to pay a penalty sum to a regulatory authority in respect of non compliance with any requirement of a regulatory nature, howsoever arising; or any liability of the director in connection with an application for relief in which the court refuses to grant him relief. Such qualifying third party indemnity provision was in force during the year and is in force as at the date of approving the Directors' Report.

### Going concern

The company is in a net current liability position as at 3 July 2022 and is utilising the collective overdraft facility which allows individual companies in the News UK group to overdraw subject to an agreed limit of £20 million, not being exceeded in aggregate. The overdraft facility is also guaranteed by News Corporation.

The ultimate parent undertaking, News Corporation (the "Parent Company") has agreed to provide continuing financial support to enable the company to meet its obligations as and when they fall due for a period until 31 December 2023.

The Parent Company will continue to review its liquidity needs in light of the business and financial impacts the company may face in light of economic factors such as the continued economic recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic, inflation and any mitigating actions that may be required.

Based on this information and on enquiries, the directors believe that they have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors acknowledge their responsibilities for preparing the Strategic Report, the Director's Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

#### **Opinion**

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs (UK) will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

# Explanation as to what extent the audit was considered capable of detecting irregularities, including froud

Irregularities, including fraud, are instances of non-compliance with laws and regulations. We design procedures in line with our responsibilities, outlined above, to detect irregularities, including fraud. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement due to fraud is higher than the risk of not detecting one resulting from error, as fraud may involve deliberate concealment by, for example, forgery or intentional misrepresentations, or through collusion. The extent to which our procedures are capable of detecting irregularities, including fraud is detailed below. However, the primary responsibility for the prevention and detection of fraud rests with both those charged with governance of the entity and management.

Explanation as to what extent the audit was considered capable of detecting irregularities, including fraud (continued)

Our approach was as follows:

- We obtained an understanding of the legal and regulatory frameworks that are applicable to the company and
  determined that the most significant are those that relate to the reporting framework (FRS 102 "The
  Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006)
  and the relevant direct and indirect tax compliance regulations in the United Kingdom.
- We understood how the company is complying with those frameworks by making enquiries of management
  and those responsible for legal matters and compliance. We corroborated these enquiries through our review
  of policies and board meeting minutes. We reviewed management's entity level controls to understand the
  company culture of honest and ethical behaviour, including the emphasis on fraud prevention.
- We assessed the susceptibility of the company's financial statements to material misstatement, including
  how fraud might occur through inquiry of management and those charged with governance as to established
  policies and procedures that exist. We considered the procedures and controls that the company has
  established to address risks identified, or that otherwise prevent, deter and detect fraud and gained an
  understanding as to how those procedures and controls are implemented and monitored.
- Based on this understanding we designed our audit procedures to identify non-compliance with such laws and regulations and to respond to the assessed risks. We determined there to be a risk of management override and a fraud risk over manual adjustments to revenue. To address the fraud risk on revenue, we used data analytics to identify the population of manual journal entries impacting revenue and selected a sample of specific transactions. We understood the transactions identified for testing and agreed them to source documentation. To address the risk of management override of controls we used data analytics to sample from the entire population of journal entries, identifying transactions which did not meet our expectations based on specific criteria, to investigate, gain an understanding and agree to source documentation. Our procedures also included verifying that material transactions are recorded in compliance with FRS 102 and where appropriate Companies Act 2006. Compliance with other operational laws and regulations was covered through inquiry with management and the Directors, reading of the board meeting minutes and correspondence with the relevant authorities with no indication of non-compliance identified. Furthermore, we performed procedures to conclude on the compliance of disclosures made in the annual report and accounts with all applicable requirements.

# Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 3 July 2022

#### 1 General information

The company is a private company limited by shares incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act.

The address of its registered office is: 1 London Bridge Street London SE1 9GF

These financial statements were authorised for issue by the Board on 16 November 2022.

The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Strategic Report on page 1.

#### 2 Accounting policies

#### Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

#### Statement of compliance

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value.

The preparation of financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the company accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are disclosed in note below.

Starting with the current period the financial statements will be made up to the Sunday closest to the 30 June each year. Consequently, the financial statements for the current year cover 53 weeks ended 3 July 2022 (prior period 26 weeks ended 27 June 2021). The financial statements are presented in pounds sterling which is the functional currency of the company, and rounded to the nearest £'000.

#### Summary of disclosure exemptions

FRS 102 paragraph 1.12 allows a qualifying entity certain disclosure exemptions, subject to certain conditions which have been complied with, including notification of and no objection to the use of exemptions by the company's shareholders. The equivalent disclosures are included in the consolidated financial statements of News Corporation, the ultimate parent undertaking.

The company has taken advantage of the following exemptions:

#### Revenue recognition

Turnover comprises the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for the sale of goods and provision of services in the ordinary course of the company's activities. Turnover is shown net of sales/value added tax, returns, rebates and discounts. The company recognises revenue when:

- The amount of revenue can be reliably measured;
- It is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity; and
- Specific criteria have been met for each of the company's activities.

#### Tax

Taxation expense for the reporting period comprises current tax recognised in the reporting period. Tax is recognised in the profit and loss account, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is the amount payable in respect of the taxable profit for the year or prior years. Tax is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

#### 2 Accounting policies (continued)

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### **Debtors**

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

#### Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using effective interest method.

#### **Pensions**

The employees of the company participate in a defined contribution pension scheme; the amount charged to the profit and loss account in respect of pension costs is the contributions payable in the year. Differences between contributions payable in the year and contributions actually paid are shown as either accruals or prepayments in the balance sheet.

#### Related party transactions

As a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of News Corporation whose financial statements are publicly available, the company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 102 Section 33 'Related Party Disclosures' not to disclose transactions with other wholly owned members of the group headed by News Corporation.

# Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

No critical judgements or key sources of estimation uncertainty in applying the company's accounting policies have been identified in the current or preceding year.
