#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Oneragtime Hoomano Limited (the 'company') for the year ended 31 October 2021 which comprise the Profit and loss account, Other Comprehensive Income, Balance Sheet, Statement of Changes in Equity, Cash Flow Statement and Notes to the Cash Flow Statement, Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. We evaluated the director's and managements incentives and opportunities for fraudulent manipulation of the financial statements (including management override of controls) and determined the principal risks were related to the miss appropriation of investor funds, management bias through application of judgement and assumptions in significant accounting estimates particularly relating to the recoverable amount of the fixed asset investment.

Owing to the inherent limitations of an audit, there is an unavoidable risk that we may not have detected some material misstatements in the financial statements even though we have properly planned and, performed our audit in accordance with auditing standards; For example, the further removed none compliance with laws and regulations is from the events and transactions reflected in the financial statements, the less likely the inherently limited procedures required by auditing standard would identify it.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2021

#### 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Oneragtime Hoomano Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Euro (€).

#### 2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006.

### 3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis. The financial statements are prepared in euro, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Despite the current uncertainties arising from Corona Virus, the director has assessed the recoverable amount of the fixed asset investment shown at note six through reviewing cashflow forecasts of the investee company and remains confident in the success of this company and considers the going concern basis of preparation to be appropriate and therefore the investment strategy remains unchanged.

### Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

### Revenue recognition

Turnover is recognised in respect of management fees recharging professional fees incurred during the year under review.

### Going concern

The company's management continue to monitor the effects of Covid 19 outbreak that was declared a global Pandemic by the World Health Organisation during January 2020.

The Board continues to review the Company's position to the direct and indirect impact of Covid 19 and will take action to protect its capital position as appropriate. With limited balance sheet exposure to market volatility, the company is mostly exposed to risk from slow or depressed trading conditions for the entity into which funds are invested. Many segments of the global economy are performing well despite the emergence of some supply chain issues. Notwithstanding the continued disruption caused by Covid 19 the director remains confident in the investment strategy adopted and believes the going concern basis or preparation remains appropriate having considered a period of twelve months from the date of signing these financial statements.

### Investments

Where possible, equity investments will be valued in accordance with IPEVC (International Private Equity & Venture Capital) Valuation Guidelines, otherwise they will be valued at cost less impairment. As the investee companies that the fund has invested into are not listed the valuation would be based on the last issued share price. Where investments are revalued upwards they do not take into account any performance fee costs recognised against the investment.

### 3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

### Impairment of fixed assets

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.
