- Completed a DCMS-funded media literacy and online safety project for African and Caribbean people over 55 in Southampton
- Equipped people with modern digital media and social media skills for employment
- Equipped African, Caribbean and Black British community groups with digital media and social media skills to amplify their voices, projects and advocate for themselves
- Held a black communities stories screening to share videos made by people from Southampton's African, Caribbean and Black British communities on a big screen
- Provided free PR, media and comms drop-in consultations for black community organisation leaders and volunteers to help promote their projects, events and causes
- Increased authentic and positive representation of black communities in the stories and images seen locally and online
