During the financial year ending 30th November 2021, African Voices Platform C.I.C produced quality television, radio and articles which centred on health and well-being and information cascading targeted at African and Caribbean communities in South Yorkshire and the UK to respond to the COVID 19 crisis.

A dedicated strand for COVID-19 was established and covered the following:

- Understanding lockdown rules and adherence
- Vaccine information contextualised by faith
- Vaccine hesitancy
- Support for refugees and asylum seekers in the wake of charities shutting down
- Food banks
- Travel and quarantine information on the back of red-listing

We hosted faith, cultural and health sector leaders, local government officials and academics. We also platformed women of refugee and asylum seeking backgrounds to centre their unique challenges during the lockdown.

Further, we expanded our coverage and team to address economic, climate and democracy discourse to enhance community participation in decision-making and understanding our roles in ensuring elected representatives are serving their purpose.

With the host studio closing due to the risks of the pandemic, our team moved to operate digitally from our homes. We sourced funding to purchase equipment that enables us to work from home and produce content during the crisis.

African Voices Platform TV became the second highest rated show on our host network which sees 30,000 people tuned in monthly.

Our online YouTube viewer numbers also increased to 5000 views a month attracting a wide scope beyond South Yorkshire.

Our model ensures that people who've historically been marginalised or excluded in media professionally as well as participation can genuinely have a voice. Using media skills to leverage media opportunities for people from racialised backgrounds, the future is for us to provide authentic, objective media coverage.

We also produced resources that were in multiple languages understood by the communities we work with. A women's group based in Sheffield became an advisory partner in informing and shaping some of the coverage.

Sheffield City Council and the Voluntary Community Sector engaged us as a COVID 19 response partner.
