

It also features various amateur cultural events involving migrant women. It's a way of empowering and encouraging a sense of independence among women who often accompany spouses to the UK.

A more important aspect of our work is that with supporting migrant women who fall victim to domestic abuse. Through a pool of volunteers, we provide the whole gamut of services, from advice and counselling to organizing shelter for victims. We have provided such help for hundreds of victims and through our work have successfully campaigned governmental entities both here in the UK and India to create policies that support and protect victims.


