- We continued to provide discounted one-to-one music tuition to students of different ages, backgrounds and abilities, including SEN, offering a different learning experience not readily available, and at an affordable price

- We delivered the "Beats and Bars" music workshop project, offering free access to our music studio and group learning in an informal environment for young people in Trowbridge.
- We supported Trowbridge Town Hall Trust in developing a music outreach programme, and supported their funding application. This programme will bring new music experiences to young people in the Trowbridge area during the Town Hall's closure period in 2024/25.
- We provided free technical support and music equipment for Trowbridge Town Hall to support their music programme.
