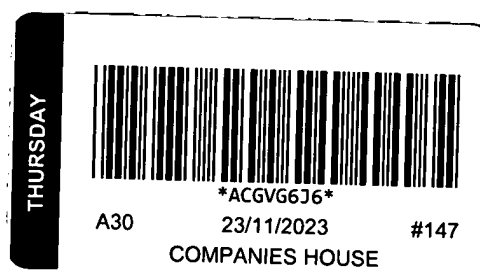

During the period the average number of employees was 2.



We have been actively involved in creating various events and exhibitions aimed at creating awareness, breaking stigma and helping the community. These events have included curating and attending exhibitions, parliamentary visits, open mic nights and conferences.

We have also partnered with university students, clinical psychologists, FosterWiki, Drum and Brass and the NHS - as well as a number of others to showcase the impact of being in care and how creative arts can help. Through these events and exhibitions, the organization has been able to create a sense of community, fulfill dreams and break stigma.

We have been going around to organizations including education providers and residential homes, delivering a range of workshops based on improving the relationships with young people. The organization is made up of children and family practitioners with lived experience of the care system. This valuable, creative insight has been able to improve the relationship with young people that others work with. Service development is necessary from lived experience leaders to ensure that young people are equipped with the right tools to succeed.

Art remedy workshops have been delivered all around the UK, reaching as far as Glasgow supporting those living within disadvantaged groups by designing tailored, creative workshops and allowing a space for learning, healing and growth. Art has been proven to help those disadvantaged groups by providing an avenue for expression, a way to process emotions and improve mental health.

Our focus has mainly been on care leavers. Within the next 2 years, the organization hopes to have a helpline set up to enable appropriate signposting, a place where care leavers can go for support. This helpline will provide a safe space for care leavers to talk and receive the necessary support they need. The organization believes that every care leaver deserves the opportunity to succeed and will continue to work towards providing the necessary tools to achieve this.

Children of a revolution have been through a lot, but we have not let their trauma hold us back. In fact, they have used our experiences to fuel creativity and inspire others. We have been working closely with these individuals in a professional and personal nature to ensure that everyone has access to the arts, regardless of their background or circumstances.

One of the key areas we focus on is helping people understand the care system and the challenges faced by children in care. We believe that by raising awareness and providing support, we can help these children overcome their difficulties and thrive.

In addition to this, we also work with other disadvantaged groups to provide opportunities for expression and growth through the arts. We believe that everyone should have the chance to explore their creativity and find their voice, no matter what obstacles they may face.

Through our work, we have seen firsthand the incredible impact that the arts can have on people's lives. They can help us heal, connect with others, and find hope and meaning in even the darkest of times. We are committed to continuing our efforts to ensure that everyone has the chance to experience the transformative power of the arts.


