

This Girl's Ability is a non-profit organisation that works to provide sports and creative opportunities to girls and young women with disabilities.

Based in the London Borough of Havering, we offer an exciting range of activities for young people in East London and Essex. These include creative hobbies, access to sports, volunteering opportunities and workshops.

We currently offer weekly Multi-Sports Clubs, Fun Football Sessions, Pop Culture Club (fashion, arts and crafts, movies, tv, music and books), Swim Club and trips.

We aim to empower girls and young women with disabilities through sports and creative opportunities. This Girl's Ability seeks to tackle loneliness by encouraging meaningful relationships with peers, assisting in the prevention and management of poor mental health, and enhancing physical well-being.

This Girl's Ability is committed to promoting equal access to sports and developing creative ways of adapting and modifying activities to ensure our sports sessions are more inclusive and that all young people experience the rewards of being part of a team.

This Girl's Ability aspires to collaborate with like-minded professionals and organisations who share our mission and to provide sports and creative opportunities to more East London Boroughs and other areas of Essex.

The team has extensive experience working with young people with disabilities and numerous qualifications and certifications, which include: First Aid, Youth Mental Health First Aid, Epilepsy Awareness, Safeguarding children and young people with SEND, Autism Awareness, and sports-specific training. We take pride in ensuring our staff and volunteers keep their skills and knowledge up to date through regular training and continuing professional development.

The staffing team includes members with disabilities, providing our members with positive and inspirational role models.

All our staff and volunteers pass a Disclosure Barring Service (DBS) check, and outside activity providers/coaches must provide evidence of a DBS. DBS Checks are an essential part of our safeguarding requirements, and certificates are renewed at various points to ensure they are up to date.

We couldn't be prouder of what we have achieved as we reflect on the skills gained, increased confidence, new meaningful friendships formed, and decreased isolation through greater connections in the community.

In our first year (8.5 months of services Jan '23 – Sep '23), we have attracted 89 girls/women with disabilities plus their siblings/friends.

We have provided:

- 56 Football sessions. West Ham United Women player Amber Tysiak supports our Havering Hub.
- 44 multi-sports sessions, which included specialist sports coaches providing basketball, Zumba, yoga, cricket (Take Her Lead & Essex Cricket in the Community) and hockey (Havering Hockey Club).
- 8 Pop Culture Clubs (Workshop by LDComics and a visit to Kensington Palace for exhibition Crown to Couture)
- 37 Swimming sessions led by British Paralympic swimmer Brock Whiston
- 2 Sports & Family Fun events (Feb & Aug)
- Sports Day in collaboration with New City College's International programme with students from the Netherlands, Finland & Portugal (Apr)
- Colour Festival (June) in partnership with Writtle University College
- Mayor's Community Weekend (June)
- Parallel Windsor Fundraiser with our patron Rosie Jones (Jul)
- Football tournament hosted by West Ham Women at their training ground (Aug)
- Water Sports session hosted by Writtle University College (Aug)
- 3 Tennis Camps in collaboration with Havering Tennis Club (Aug)
- 2 Sporting Events West Ham Women's Match as part of the Level Playing Field United for Access celebrations (Mar)/Lord's T20 Cricket Match (Jul)

We are particularly proud of our fun football programme, which is still growing in popularity and has engaged 47 members. This Girl's Ability Football shirts are now given to members to boost morale, feel part of the group and be identifiable as belonging to a club.

We have received the following feedback from our young people/families:

"They are brilliant so attentive; they make sure everyone is included and communicate really well with lots of information about upcoming events. Everyone is approachable and friendly".

"I just wanted to thank you for running girl's disability sessions. My daughter is unable to attend school due to severe anxiety and avoids social clubs. Multi-sports and football is the only place she will happily attend".

"They give me confidence that I am good at football, make me feel involved and not left out, and it's good exercise and I can meet new friends and have a fun time, I leave feeling happy and proud of myself, not like when I'm at school I'm left out of activities and lose my confidence".

'B' had made more friends, gaining more confidence and routine helps her too! In the last session, she let me watch whilst she played with one of the other girls, which is amazing progress!"

"Being accepted for who you are without fear of bullying."

"It is fantastic to have a weekend session to go to. A lot of after-school clubs for SEN children start too early and don't cater for children who arrive home late on school transport. Some clubs can be overwhelming when they are busy with children who are physically able and aren't able to understand to respect a physically disabled person's personal space which can cause anxiety. 'C' loves coming to Girls Ability Club as she sees new children and can hopefully build friendships over time".

"Being fully inclusive and non-judgemental".

"A way of socialising outside of school, building confidence in new environments, making new friends, staying active, reducing anxiety, becoming more independent, building strength through exercise".

"N" is so happy and relaxed. Something that rarely happens. She absolutely loves the group".

The This Girl's Ability Director team meet quarterly to review our programmes and work together to ensure our organisation is carrying out its activities for the benefit of the community.

Our members and volunteers are consulted through discussions at our club nights and sports sessions and through regular surveys to gain their feedback on what we are doing well or what we could do better to support them.

We have seen increased confidence from our members who share ideas to shape their sessions and feel this has been key to successful engagement and high retention. The team will continue to document any visible impacts to support case studies.

We have supported ten young volunteers across our programmes and are now focusing on training to provide them with the confidence to assist staff and gain employability skills.

This Girl's Ability has received support from the following funders/donors: Active Essex, Sported, Barclays, National Lottery, Sport England, Crowdunder, Mid-South Essex Microgrant, Progress Project, Asda Community Foundation, London Borough of Barking and Dagenham, Access Sport, Essex Community Foundation, Sycamore Trust, Hammers for Work and Support Group, families, friends, and supporters. We have actively shared statistics, case studies, photos, and quotes with our funders/donors via tags in social media posts when sharing the impact their grants have made on the community.
