Directors' report

For the year ended 31 March 2004

The Directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2004.

Principal activities and review of the development of the business

The Group is engaged in the development, manufacture, supply and marketing of pharmaceutical and medicinal preparations. During the year the Group increased its product lines, developed its overseas markets and actively sought new licensing and acquisition opportunities.

Results for the year and state of affairs at 31 March 2004

The consolidated profit and loss account for the year ended 31 March 2004 is set out on page 7 while the consolidated balance sheet at that date is set out on pages 9 and 10. Profit on ordinary activities after taxation and before minority interest for the year amounted to €18,370,000 (2003 - €16,493,000). Retained profit for the year was €2,736,000 (2003 - €4,443,000). The net assets attributable to Group shareholders at 31 March 2004 amounted to €122,460,000 (2003 - €123,038,000).

Dividends and retentions

The Directors declared and paid dividends of €14,363,000 for the year (2003 - €12,464,000). No other distributions or transfers to reserves are recommended by the Directors for fiscal year 2004.

Future developments in the business

The Group will continue to develop its current market through re-investment of its profits and will seek increased expansion through further investment, licensing and acquisitions.

Research and development

The Group continues to be heavily committed to a programme of research and development activities.

Notes to the financial statements

31 March 2004

1. Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the valuation of investments to market value and Irish generally accepted accounting principles and are stated in Euro. The principal accounting policies adopted by the Group, are set out below. These are unchanged from the previous year with the exception of the adoption in full of Financial Reporting Standard 17 "Retirement Benefits," the effects of which are explained in note 25. A prior year adjustment of ϵ 4,376,000 is the cumulative prior year effect of this change of accounting policy and has been charged against reserves.

a) Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the financial statements of the Company and each of its subsidiaries for the year ended 31 March 2004. The results of subsidiaries acquired or disposed of during the year are included in the consolidated profit and loss account from, or up to, the effective date of acquisition or disposal. All significant intercompany transactions have been eliminated.

b) Intangible fixed assets

Intangible fixed assets are shown at cost less accumulated amortisation and are amortised over the period during which the Group is expected to benefit, currently five to twenty years. Provision is made for any impairment.

c) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of the assets over their expected useful lives at the following rates per annum:

d) Financial fixed assets

In the consolidated financial statements, investments in associated companies are not accounted for using the equity method, because the Company is not in a position to exercise a significant influence over these companies. Interests in subsidiary and associated undertakings are stated in the Company balance sheet at cost.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

e) Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of purchase cost on a first in, first out basis and net realisable value. Cost in the case of raw materials and packaging materials consists of direct material costs together with any relevant duty and freight costs. In the case of work-in-progress and finished goods, cost includes materials, labour and an appropriate proportion of factory overhead based on a normal level of activity.

Net realisable value is based on the estimated normal selling price, less further costs expected to be incurred on completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete, slow moving and defective stocks, where appropriate.

f) Government grants

Capital grants relating to fixed assets are shown as a deferred credit and are credited to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the expected useful lives of the assets to which they relate.

Revenue grants are credited to the profit and loss account in the same period as the related expense is incurred.

g) Foreign currency

Foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are translated into Euro at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Foreign currency transactions are translated using the exchange rates ruling at the date of the transactions. Gains or losses on translation are credited or charged in the consolidated profit and loss account as they arise.

For the purpose of consolidation, the balance sheets of the foreign subsidiaries not in the Euro zone are translated into Euro at the closing exchange rate. The profit and loss accounts of foreign subsidiaries not in the Euro zone are translated into Euro at the average rate of exchange for the year. Movements in translation gains or losses are included in the translation reserve in the consolidated balance sheet. Where a subsidiary operates in a country with a hyperinflationary economy, the results are re-measured into a stable currency by applying the temporal method prior to being translated into Euro.

h) Research and development

Research and development costs are expensed as incurred.

i) Taxation

Current tax is provided on taxable profits using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less, or receive more tax. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Notes to the financial statements (continued)

1. Accounting policies (continued)

i) Taxation (continued)

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing difference can be deducted.

i) Pension costs

The Group accounts for pension schemes in accordance with FRS 17 "Retirement Benefits." For defined contribution schemes, contributions are charged to the profit and loss account as payable in respect of the accounting period. For defined benefit schemes the amounts charged to operating profit are the current service costs and gains and losses on settlements and curtailments. They are included as part of staff costs. Past service costs are recognised immediately in the profit and loss account if the benefits have vested. If the benefits have not vested immediately, the costs are recognised over the period the vesting occurs. The interest cost and the expected return on assets are shown as a net amount of other finance costs or credits adjacent to interest. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

Where defined benefit schemes are funded, the assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the Group, in separate trustee administered funds. Pension schemes assets are measure at fair value and liabilities are measured on an actuarial basis using the projected unit method and discounted at a rate equivalent to the current rate of return on a high quality corporate bond of equivalent currency and term to the scheme liabilities. The actuarial valuations are obtained at least triennially and are updated on the balance sheet date. The resulting defined benefit asset or liability, net of the related deferred taxation, is presented separately after other net assets on the face of the balance sheet.

k) Group turnover

Group turnover comprises the value of sales (excluding VAT and similar taxes, trade discounts and intragroup transactions) of goods and services in the normal course of business.

l) Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

m) Investments

Investments held as current assets are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. All such investments are readily marketable.

Unlisted investments, which relate primarily to time deposits, are stated at historical cost.

n) Finance Leases

Assets held under leasing arrangements that transfer substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to the Group are capitalised. The capital element of the related rental obligations is included in creditors. The interest element of the rental obligations is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge in proportion to the capital balances outstanding.
