BASIS FOR QUALIFIED OPINION ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

With respect to the company's investment property having a carrying value of £3 million, the evidence available to us was limited. The director of the company has complied fully with the requirements of accounting standards in respect of this property and has valued the investment property to the best of his ability, at open market value as required by SSAP 19 - Accounting for Investment Properties. However, in the current market conditions, we are unable to make an assessment of the accuracy of this valuation. Owing to the unstable nature of the current property environment we were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the valuation of investment property by using other audit procedures.

QUALIFIED OPINION

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matters described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements:

- Give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 December 2012 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- Have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and
- Have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

OPINION ON OTHER MATTERS PRESCRIBED BY THE COMPANIES ACT 2006

NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets, and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

Cash flow statement

The director has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small.

Turnover

Turnover represents the total amounts derived from rentals receivable on lettings to tenants, accrued on a time basis, by reference to the agreements entered.

Investment property

Investment properties are shown at their open market value. The surplus or deficit arising from the annual revaluation is transferred to the investment revaluation reserve unless a deficit, or its reversal, on an individual investment property is expected to be permanent, in which case it is recognised in the profit and loss account for the year.

This is in accordance with SSAP 19 which, unlike the Companies Act 2006, does not require depreciation of investment properties. Investment properties are held for their investment potential and not for use by the company and so their current value is of prime importance. The departure from the provisions of the Act is required in order to give a true and fair view.

Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Taxation

Corporation tax is calculated on the results for the year.

Tax deferred as a result of timing differences between accounting and taxation profits is provided for in full in respect of deferred tax liabilities with the exception of differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets, where the gain or loss on such a sale has not been recognised in the financial statements. The provision is made at the taxation rates at which the differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that they are regarded recoverable.

Tax losses are surrendered between group companies for no consideration.
