Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under company law the trustees must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, for that period. In preparing these financial statements, trustees are required to:

1. Accounting Policies

Statement of compliance

Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Basis of preparation

Ballymarlow & District Community Group meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the company.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Incoming resources

- Grants are recognised when the charity has an entitlement to the funds and any conditions linked to the grants have been met. Where performance conditions are attached to the grant are yet to be met, the income is recognised as a liability and included on the balance sheet as deferred income to be released.
- Donations comprise amounts receivable during the year.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the company to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis.

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities.
- Support costs represents overhead costs attributable to the furtherance of the objects of the charity.
- Management and administration includes all other expenditure not directly allocated above.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at the following rates in order to write off each asset over its useful life.

Leasehold property

Over the term of the lease

Going concern

The directors note that the balance sheet shows a net liability position at the reporting date and undertake to increase its fundraising and other activities to bring the company back into a net asset position.

Accordingly the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting.
