THRIP ENTERPRISES LLP NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1. Accounting policies

The full accounts from which the abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting by limited liability partnerships'.

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The LLP made a loss of £198,967 for the year ended 31 March 2016 and at that date, the LLP's current liabilities exceeded its assets by £683,068. Lady Carole Bamford has confirmed that she will provide financial support to enable the LLP to continue as a going concern and pay its liabilities as they fall due for a period of at least one year from the date of approval of these accounts by the designated members. On this basis, the designated members consider it appropriate to prepare the accounts on the going concern basis. The accounts do not include any adjustments that would be required in the event of the withdrawal of this support.

Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the LLP in respect of food and drink supplied during the period, net of Value Added Tax.

Intangible fixed assets

Goodwill arising on acquisition is the difference between the fair value of the consideration given and the fair value of the net assets acquired. It is included in the balance sheet and is being amortised over a period of 10 years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided on cost in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets concerned. The following annual rates are used.

Plant and machinery Fixtures and fittings

20% straight line 10% straight line

Computer equipment

straight line over 3 years

Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Stocks

Stocks are value at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stock.
