Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (Effective April 2008).

Tangible fixed assets - Depreciation

Depreciation is provided after taking account of any grants receivable, at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold buildings - 2% on cost or revalued amounts Plant and machinery - 15% on cost Fixtures and fittings - 10% on cost Motor vehicles - 25% on cost No depreciation is provided on freehold land

Intangible fixed assets

Intangible fixed assets (including purchased goodwill and patents) are amortised at rates calculated to write off the assets on a straight basis over their estimated useful economic lives, not to exceed twenty years. Impairment of intangible assets is only reviewed where circumstance indicate that the carrying value of an asset may not be fully recoverable.

Stocke

Stocks and work-in-progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items. Cost includes all direct expenditure and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated in the balance sheet at cost less any provision made for impairment in value. Such assets are classified as current assets when regarded as available for sale. The cost of fixed assets acquired or accumulated in order to provide facilities for research and development and set up activities over a number of accounting periods shall be capitalised and written off over their useful lives through the profit and loss account.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter. The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability. Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Current asset investments

Current asset investments are initially be stated in the financial statements at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Where listed shares are held as a current asset investment, the following information is disclosed:

- (a) the aggregate market value of those investments where it differs from their balance sheet amount; and
- (b) both the market value and the stock exchange value of any investments, of which the market value is taken as being higher than the stock exchange value.

Foreign Currency Translation

Each asset, liability, revenue or cost arising from a transaction denominated in a foreign currency is translated into the local currency at the exchange rate in operation on the date on which the transaction occurred; if the rates do not fluctuate significantly, an average rate for a period may be used as an approximation. Where the transaction is to be settled at a contracted rate, that rate shall be used. Where a trading transaction is covered by a related or matching forward contract, the rate of exchange specified in that contract may be used.
