AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE DIRECTORS OF WAVERLEY STEAM NAVIGATION CO. LTD. IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 24 OF SCHEDULE 8 TO THE COMPANIES ACT 1985

We have examined the abbreviated accounts on pages 3 to 5 together with the full financial statements of Waverley Steam Navigation Co. Ltd. for the year ended 31st October 1994. The scope of our work for the purpose of this report was limited to confirming whether the company is entitled to the exemptions claimed in the Directors' Statement on page 3 and whether the abbreviated accounts have been properly prepared from the full financial statements.

In our opinion the company is entitled to the exemptions claimed in the Directors' Statement on page 3 and the abbreviated accounts have been properly prepared in accordance with Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1985.

On 16th August 1995 we reported, as auditors of Waverley Steam Navigation Co. Ltd., to the members on the full financial statements prepared under Section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 for the year ended 31st October 1994 and our audit report was as follows:

"We have audited the financial statements on pages 5 to 9 which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out on page 7.

Respective Responsibilities of Directors and Auditors

As described above the Company's Directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of Opinion

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Accounting Convention

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) Consolidation

The Company and its subsidiary comprise a small group. The Company has therefore taken advantage of the exemptions provided by Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts.

(c) Cash Flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the Company as a small reporting entity is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 'Cash Flow Statements'.

(d) Grants and Donations

Grants received in respect of fixed assets have been credited to a Deferred Grant account and are released to revenue over the expected useful life of the asset. Donations received are credited direct to the Income and Expenditure Account.

(e) <u>Depreciation</u>

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost, less residual value, of each asset over its expected useful life as follows:-

Vessels - 10% straight line per annum Catering Equipment - 33 1/3% " " " "
