1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost convention.

Having regard to the group's committed facilities and the forecast future funding requirements of the company the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to meet its liabilities as they fall due. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared for the 52 week trading period from 2 January 2011 to 31 December 2011. The comparative period is for the 52 week trading period ended 1 January 2011.

The company is exempt from the requirements of FRS 1 Cash Flow Statements to prepare a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of a parent undertaking which has produced a cash flow statement.

As the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of VION Holding NV, it has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 Related Party Disclosures and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the group.

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the results for the period and takes into account deferred tax. Deferred tax is recognised undiscounted, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date.

2 Profit on ordinary activities before taxation

Auditors' remuneration for the current and prior year has been borne by the parent company. The amount attributable to this company for audit services is £1,000 (2010: £3,000) and for other services £Nil (2010: £Nil).

3 Remuneration of directors

The aggregate emoluments of A M Christiaanse, S R W Francis and M A Steven were borne by VION Food Group Limited. The aggregate emoluments of L A M Vernaus were borne by VION Holding NV. The aggregate emoluments of P J Miller were borne by VION Food UK Limited. Their remuneration is disclosed in the accounts of those companies but it has not been practical to allocate their remuneration between their services as executives of this company and other group companies.
