DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 September 1996.

ACTIVITIES

The company's principal activity is the provision of plantation machinery.

RESULTS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company made a profit after tax of £11,062 (1995: loss £54,069). The directors do consider however that trading conditions are improving and that the long term prospects are more encouraging.

DIVIDENDS AND TRANSFERS TO RESERVES

A dividend was paid during the year of £4,012 (1995: £12,475). No further dividend is proposed and the profit for the financial year after tax and dividends of £7,050 (1995: loss £66,544) has been transferred to reserves.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The financial position of the company as shown on page 6, is considered to be satisfactory.

DIRECTORS

The present membership of the board is set out on page 1. All directors served throughout the year.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Intangible fixed assets

Purchased goodwill is amortised over five years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is not provided on freehold land. On other assets it is provided on cost in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The rates of depreciation are as follows:

Motor vehicles	25% per annum

Equipment and computer 20% per annum

Plant and machinery 20% per annum

Freehold property 2% per annum

Stocks and work in progress

Stocks and work in progress are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost represents materials, direct labour and appropriate production overheads.

Pension costs

Pension costs charged to the profit and loss account represent amounts payable to one independently administered fund.

Leases

Assets obtained under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised at their fair value on acquisition and depreciated over their useful lives. The finance charges are allocated over the period of the lease rentals in proportion to the capital element outstanding.



2 TURNOVER

Turnover represents amounts derived from the provision of goods and services which fall within the company's ordinary activities after deduction of trade discounts and value added tax.

The turnover and pre-tax profit, which arise in United Kingdom and overseas, are attributable to the company's principal activity.

The Articles of Association of the company stipulate that on a return of assets on liquidation or otherwise, the assets of the company remaining after the payment of its liabilities shall be applied firstly, in paying to the holders of the preference shares in aggregate the sum of £769,124 being equal to the net asset value of the company as disclosed in the statutory audited balance sheet of the company as at 30 September 1990; and, secondly, the balance of such assets shall be distributed amongst the ordinary shareholders.
