Voluntary Action Resource Centre (Falkirk and District) Ltd Directors' Report

The directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2002. The directors have adopted the provisions of the Statement Of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and reporting by Charities" issued in October 2000 in preparing the annual report and accounts of the charity.

Objects of the Charity, Principal Activities and Organisation of our work

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association.

The charity has no share capital. The liability of the members is restricted to £1 in the event the company should wind up.

Principal Activities and Achievements

Falkirk Voluntary Action Resource Centre's (VARC's) principal objectives are to:

- provide information and support to local communities and voluntary organisations in order to ensure that local views are heard at local and national level.
- to support policy development and help share good practice.
- to facilitate access to funding, produce publications, provide training and provide technical support for local voluntary organisations and community groups.

During the reported year the organisation continued to provide support to local voluntary sector organisations through publishing the Inform Newsletter, by providing meeting facilities for 55 voluntary organisations or groups, by holding a Funders Fair in partnership with Falkirk Council and by providing specialised consultancy support to 12 local organisations.

The organisation commissioned some extensive research on the subject of volunteering throughout the area, in order to guide our future work on this subject.

The grant from the National Lottery Charities Board (Community Fund) which funded the Information Resource Unit, came to an end in June 2001 and it was decided to retain the two staff until the Directors had considered with the new Chief Executive Officer, how the organisation should proceed in the future.

The work of the Social Economy Unit drew towards its close during the year. An in depth evaluation exercise was begun in order to assess the impact of the Fruit Barras - a pilot healthy food initiative bringing growers and consumers closer together and giving consumers access to locally grown fruit and vegetables at a convenient location. This initiative especially benefited older people, whose limited mobility impaired their ability to shop for those type of items in supermarkets.

The voluntary sector continued to be represented by VARC on partnership bodies such as the Community Urban Regeneration Programmes (CURP) Board, The Community Learning Partnership and Development staff made a very valuable contribution to the Community Education Approaches Training Pack. These training materials will assist staff from other disciplines to utilise community development techniques in the furtherance of their own work.

A substantial development for the organisation was the introduction of a completely new IT system at the end of the year. Whilst the purchase of the equipment was possible through grant funding, the Directors have recognised the need for investment of both staff time and financial resources in order to ensure that the organisation does not become digitally excluded and is able to communicate effectively with its local partners. Substantial training has begun to be undertaken by the staff on the new system and all business processes are being reviewed in order that the maximum efficiency impact will be achieved.

Further details on the organisations activity is available in the published Annual Review.

Transactions and Financial Position

The Statement of Financial Activities shows net deficit for the year of (£15,929), with reserves totalling £60,417 of which £24,130 are unrestricted.

Reserves

It is the Directors' intention to establish free reserves equivalent to at least 3 months operating costs. At present the free reserves do not reach this target level and the Directors are considering ways in which additional unrestricted funds will be raised.

Risks

The Directors have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and have taken steps to mitigate these risks
