ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The accounting reference date of the company is the nearest Saturday to 15th September. Accordingly these accounts have been prepared for the 52 week period ended 17 September 2011. The comparatives are for the 53 week period ended 18 September 2010.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

As explained in the directors' report, the company has ceased trading. The financial statements have been prepared on a basis other than that of going concern which includes, where appropriate, writing down the Company's assets to net realisable value.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing consolidated accounts afforded by the Companies Act 2006 because it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Associated British Foods plc which prepares consolidated accounts which are publicly available. These financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not part of its group. The company is also, on this basis, exempt from the requirement of Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 (Revised), to present a cash flow statement.

TAXATION

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis.

The immediate parent undertaking is A.B. World Foods Limited, which is incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales.

The largest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Wittington Investments Limited. The smallest group in which they are consolidated is that headed by Associated British Foods plc, which is incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales.
