

Notes to the abbreviated accounts

at 30 November 2004

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002).

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures & Fittings

10% reducing balance

Motor Vehicles

- 25% reducing balance

Office equipment

10% reducing balance

Deferred taxation

Provision is made for deferred taxation, using the liability method, on all timing differences to the extent that it is probable that the liability will crystallise.

Hire purchase agreements

Assets held under hire purchase agreements are capitalised and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability and the interest is charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged in the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are included at cost less an allowance for any permanent diminution in value. Listed current asset investments are stated at the lower of cost and market value, and other current asset investments are stated at the lower of cost and estimated net realisable value.

Turnover

Turnover comprises the invoice value of development services supplied by the company exclusive of VAT.

The company owns 50% of the issued ordinary share capital of Inverness Retail & Business Park Limited, a company registered in Scotland. During its latest financial period, the year ended 31 May 2004, the accounts of Inverness Retail & Business Park Limited disclose a loss after tax of £225,490 (2003 - profit of £6,092,739) and net assets of £7,722,256 (2003 - £2,248,506).

The company owns 50% of the issued share capital of Inverness Seafield Development Company Limited, a company registered in Scotland. During its latest financial period, the year ended 28 February 2004, the accounts of Inverness Seafield Development Company Limited disclose a retained profit of £151,020 (2003 - retained loss of £38,478) and net assets of £61,546 (2003 - net liabilities of £89,474).

3. Related party transactions

During the year the company invoiced £120,000 (2003 - £120,000), and at the year end was entitled to a further £750,000 (2003 - nil) for development services supplied to Inverness Retail & Business Park Limited in which the company owns 50% of the issued ordinary share capital. The amount due from Inverness Retail & Business Park Limited at 30 November 2004 was £1,704,061 (2003 - £954,061).

Included in creditors is a loan from the directors of £13,892 (2003 - £121,300). This loan is interest free and there are no fixed terms for repayment.
