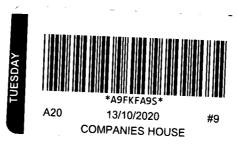

Notes to the financial statements

1. Authorisation of financial statements and statement of compliance with FRS 101

The separate financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice including Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework (FRS 101).

The company has taken advantage of the exemption under s400 of the Act not to prepare group accounts as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Petrofac Limited.

The accounting policies that follow set out those policies which apply in preparing the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2019.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

Investments

Investments in subsidiaries, associates and joint ventures are held at historical cost less any applicable provision for impairment.

Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables represent the entities right to an amount of consideration that is unconditional (i.e. only the passage of time is required before payment of the consideration is due).

2.1 Significant accounting judgements and estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the statement of financial position date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates.

The following judgements (apart from those involving estimates) have had the most significant effect on amounts recognised in the financial statements:

a) Impairment of assets

An assessment is made on intangible assets measured at cost, for possible impairment if there are events or changes in the circumstances that indicate the carrying values of the assets are not recoverable. Such indicators include changes in commodity price or land, changes in the company's business plan leading to unprofitable performance. Determination as to whether and how much an asset is impaired by, involves management estimates on highly uncertain matters such as the outlook for global or regional market supply, the effects of inflation, future commodity prices and the discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

b) Intangible fixed assets

Judgement is involved when determining the amortisation period and when assessing impairment. Impairment is assessed for individual assets and for cash generating units as a whole. The impairment testing of a cash generating unit involves judgemental assumptions about future market development, cashflows, determination of discount rate, growth rate and other assumptions that may change over time.

In accordance with IAS 36 - *Impairment of Assets*, the carrying values of investments are assessed for any indicators of impairment at the end of each reporting period to ensure they are not carried at more than their recoverable amount.

The recoverable amount has been derived from discounted cash flow projections using a pre-tax discount rate of 11.57%. Cash flows have been projected over ten years based on management's most recent business forecast. After that, a steady growth rate of 2.5% has been assumed.
