

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 8 and comply with current statutory requirements, the memorandum and articles of association, the Statement of Recommended Practice – Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### **Objects of the Charity**

The objects of the charity are to promote and encourage the study, practice, knowledge and appreciation of contemporary visual art and craft through exhibitions, out of gallery projects, residencies, activities to support artists' and makers' development and integrated educational activities throughout Fife.

The charity meets these objectives by organising a programme of activities which it delivers through partnership at different venues across Fife and beyond.

#### Structure, Governance and Management

Fife Contemporary Art and Craft (St. Andrews) Limited is a company limited by guarantee and is a charity recognised in Scotland governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

A board of trustees administers the charity. There are sub-committees established at different times to address key areas including Strategic Development, Education and Finance. A Chief Executive is appointed by the trustees to manage the day-to-day operations of the charity.

The charity seeks to recruit new trustees with appropriate skills by public advertisement and through professional contacts. The charitable company has procedures for the induction of trustees which comprise a meeting with staff, existing trustees and issue of an induction pack. During the meetings key matters such as obligations of trustees, financial and staffing issues and future plans and objectives are discussed. The induction pack contains key documents including an outline history of the charity and latest annual financial statements.

#### **Risk Management**

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the operations and finances of the charity and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the charity's exposure to the major risks including cash flow risk.

#### **Review of Activities and Achievements**

The charity's principal activities were the provision of visual art and craft activities for the public and support for craft and visual artists. Activities were delivered through a range of partner venues in Fife including this year: the Town Hall Foyer, St Andrews; St Andrews Museum; Balmungo House, by St Andrews; Zest, Vic and Byre Theatre cafes in St Andrews; Kirkcaldy Galleries; Rothes Halls, Glenrothes; Lochgelly Centre; Forgan Art Centre, Newport-on-Tay; Rosyth, Duloch and Cowdenbeath Libraries; Fife Dunfermline Printmakers Workshop.

Following the extensive application procedure FCA&C were awarded Regular Funding for the next three years from Creative Scotland.

A new website was designed and launched to comprehensively promote FCA&C's activities and provide information as a virtual venue for the organisation.

FCA&C presented the **Toby Paterson** exhibition at Kirkcaldy Galleries as part of the national GNENERATION programme. A Young Curators group from Fife College worked on the exhibition's interpretation and produced a filmed interview of the artist. Further educational activity was organised by Creative Intern Kyle Noble. A print by the artist was commissioned from Fife Dunfermline Printmakers Workshop. The exhibition was then toured to STEC partners in Inverness, Peebles and Dumfries.

The exhibition Portraits + was then devised to complement an Artists Rooms exhibition at Kirkcaldy Galleries.

The **Craft Generation** exhibition was mounted at St Andrews Museum with an associated programme of educational activity including a symposium and Meet Your Maker sessions linking to a national programme.

For StAnza poetry festival an exhibition titled **erasure>** was mounted in St Andrews Town Hall foyer. This featured work by Kevin Reid in collaboration with further poets and visual artists.

The Craft Pods toured handmade shoes by London based Carréducker whose work featured in the Crafts Council exhibition shown the previous year in St Andrews to a network of libraries.

The offsite Weather Project was completed with a talk at Lochgelly Crentre.

A three day summer school for senior school pupils from across Fife was again held in partnership with the Barns-Graham Charitable Trust at Balmungo House.

The treat craft initiative continued with a Christmas pop up Craft and Coffee Crawl event taking place across 4 venues in St Andrews. A treat online shop was created as part of the new website featuring 10 Scottish craft artists and launched with a pop up event. 5 Fife craft artists were also featured in the third FCA&C Culture Label online collection.

Over 31,377 people took part in the activities listed above in Fife with a further 11,096 visitors to Toby Paterson on tour

Support for craft and visual artists in Fife was based on FCA&C's artists' network of over 595 contacts to whom 54 newsflashes were delivered. 56 participants took part in artists professional training including the annual Artists' Forum held at Rothes Halls with Fife Cultural Trust, a mentoring day and a CEO Cascade session on funding. FCA&C managed the devolved Creative Scotland/Fife Council/Fife Cultural Trust grants for Fife Cultural Trust. 22 Opportunities Grants were awarded and 3 bursaries. FCA&C staff provided much informal advice to artists by phone, email and in person. 17 artists were employed as exhibition technicians and to deliver workshops.

#### **Future Developments**

In 2015-16 FCA&C will work closely with Fife Cultural Trust and further partners in Fife and beyond to deliver activity from its new 3 year business plan.

At Kirkcaldy Galleries the **Portraits +** exhibition continues until the end of May and includes a newly commissioned interactive sound work by Zoë Irvine.

Craft Generation tours to Paisley, Dumfries and Wicke.

The Robert Callender A2B exhibition will be shown at the Scottish Fisheries Museum, Anstruther.

An international jewellery exhibition **Heat Exchange 2** curated in Wales will be brought to St Andrews Museum and complemented with further profiling of Scottish based jewellers.

A collaboration with StAnza is planned to link poetry to craft in the online treat store.

A new Craft Pod exhibition will be created featuring work by silversmith Grant McCaig.

Marking Scotland's Year of Food & Drink a residency is being organised with Common Good Food for the Methilhill Community Children's Initiative.

Support for artists will continue through information mailings, the grant scheme and an annual Forum.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

#### **Investment Policy and Performance**

Under the memorandum the trustees are empowered to invest monies not immediately required for the furtherance of its objects.

During the year there were no balances on interest earning bank deposit.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The unrestricted reserves carried forward amount to £59,950 (2014 £64,235) which included £1 (2014 £1,003) of fixed assets in use for charitable purposes. The trustees currently have a policy to retain sums at the end of each year for reserves where possible. The trustees aim to hold at least £30,000 to meet pending operating costs and as a contingency in the event of the charity having to close down. Funds additional to this contingency fund will be dedicated to investing in new initiatives. Restricted reserves carried forward amount to £16,642 (2014 £24,195).

#### Trustees' Responsibilities in relation to the Financial Statements

The trustees (who are the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the annual report and accounts in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure of the charity for that period.

In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures
  disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015 which are set out on pages 6 to 15.

#### Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

# FIFE CONTEMPORARY ART AND CRAFT (ST ANDREWS) LIMITED (LIMITED BY GUARANTEE) NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

#### 1 Principal accounting policies

#### 1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), the Scottish Charity Regulations 2006 (as amended), applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2 Incoming resources/Revenue recognition

Voluntary income including donations, gifts and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature, and income from charitable activities are recognised when there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Such income is only deferred when the donor specifies that the grant or donation must only be used in future accounting periods; or the donor has imposed conditions which must be met before the charity has unconditional entitlement.

#### 1.3 Interest receivable

Interest is included when receivable by the charity.

#### 1.4 Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (Incorporating the Income and Expenditure Account) on an accruals basis and excluding recoverable Value Added Tax.

#### 1.5 Depreciation

Depreciation is charged on the straight line basis to reduce the cost of the asset to its net realisable value over its estimated useful life at the following rates:-

Office equipment - computer equipment

- 33.33% straight line

Individual fixed assets costing £1,800 or more are capitalised at cost.

#### 1.6 Leasing

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.7 Value Added Tax

The charity is partially exempt for Vat purposes and is therefore unable to recover all of the input Vat on its purchases. In the case of irrecoverable input Vat on the purchase of fixed assets, the irrecoverable Vat is capitalised and written off at the same rate and over the same period as is applicable to the asset purchased.

#### 1.8 Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either: Unrestricted Funds - these are the funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees. Restricted Funds - these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

#### 1.9 Cashflow statement

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is small company.

#### Think Innovation

Grant funding was obtained from Fife Cultural Trust towards activities supporting professional development for artists and a pre art college summer school for school pupils.

#### First & Next Steps

Last instalment of funding from Fife Council and Fife Cultural Trust towards artist bursaries for Roisin Connolly and Moyra Stewart.

#### Generation

Creative Scotland provided a grant towards the costs of the Generation Toby Paterson exhibition and related public engagement activity.

#### **Culture Label**

Grant funding was obtained from Creative Scotland towards the costs of special packaging for Culture Label craft items.
