

STRATEGIC REPORT

Review of the business

Turnover for the year ended 31 December 2019 was £23k (2018: £1k). The profit after taxation for the year was £36k. (2018: £7k loss). The Directors consider these to be the key performance indicators of the Company.

As of November 2019, Scottish Friendly Insurance Services Limited carries out the administration services for a book of policies held by financial services provider Canada Life in Hong Kong. These administration services were agreed as part of the transfer of a book of policies from Canada Life to Scottish Friendly Assurance Society, which completed in November 2019.

The onboarding and administration of the book earned £21k of revenue in the year, of which a significant proportion is one-off onboarding income. This servicing of this book also contributed to an increase in expenses in the year.

Another key contributor to the increase in profit in 2019 was the release of a customer redress provision, which is no longer required.

Future developments

The outlook for the Company is the continued provision of administration services to Canada Life's Hong Kong book and profits are expected to stabilise in future periods now that onboarding fees have been earned and one-off expenses incurred. Management will continue to monitor the business and consider the outlook.

Principal risks and uncertainties

Liquidity, market and credit risk are managed by the capital management policies, the compliance regime, cash flow monitoring and financial governance processes. No further disclosure is required on credit risk as cash balances are held with banks with good credit ratings.

Quarterly management accounts are prepared. The management accounts are reviewed to evaluate the performance against plan and to ensure the on-going appropriateness of the capitalisation and liquidity of the Company.

NOTES ON ACCOUNT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1. General Information and Basis of Accounting

Scottish Friendly Insurance Services is a private company limited by shares, incorporated in the UK. The address of the registered office is

Scottish Friendly House 16 Blythswood Square Glasgow G2 4HJ

The Accounts have been prepared under Financial Reporting Standard 102. The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland, which replaced the United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in 2015.

The functional currency is considered to be pounds sterling because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the company operates.

The Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue its operations for at least the next twelve months from the approval of the financial statements. Thus, they continue to adopt a going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

2. Accounting Policies

The Directors believe that there are no critical accounting judgements or key sources of estimation uncertainty which require disclosure.

Related Parties

The Company is exempt from the requirement to disclose transactions with fellow wholly owned group undertakings under section 33 of Financial Reporting Standard 102. There were no other related party transactions requiring disclosure.

Turnover

Turnover comprises fees earned in respect of the provision of administration services and commissions received in the United Kingdom. In November 2019 the company entered into an agreement to provide third party administration services for a selection of Canada Life policies regulated in Hong Kong. The fees for this (£22k) form the bulk of the turnover in the year.

This includes onboarding fees of £16k recognised in the year, for which the performance conditions were met upon the execution of certain take-on procedures.

10. Non-Adjusting Post Balance Sheet Events

COVID-19 has caused disruption to businesses and economic activity, which has been reflected in recent fluctuations in global stock markets since the year end. In this environment, the Board have recognised that the business will need to adjust its client service and operational capability as events unfold in the period ahead, and are responding by upscaling its ability to deliver these.

The potential financial impact on the financial position of the company will be seen through any financial impact on the financial position of the Group. Although, the overall financial impact of COVID-19 cannot be reliably estimated at this time, at the date that these financial statements have been approved, the Directors do not
