# SCOTTISH YOUTH DANCE FESTIVAL DIRECTORS' REPORT

For the year ended 31 March 1997

The Directors' present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 1997.

#### THE COMPANY

The Company is Limited by Guarantee and does not have a share capital. It has been approved as a Charity by the Inland Revenue. The Scottish Charity Number is ED 229/88/PBL.

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company is the advancement of public education by the promotion and development of the Arts and in particular the Arts of dance, music and mime in all their forms.

# STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those accounts, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the accounts on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### **REVIEW OF BUSINESS**

The directors consider that this period was good and a great deal of work was achieved. During the period the company ran a successful one week dance Festival, including dance development work in the host area leading up to the Festival, a much praised one day Conference in March 1997, a series of training courses for youth leaders, other outreach development work and has implemented plans for exciting future events and further training courses.

#### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

Since the year end, the company has been preparing for the next Festival in Renfrew in July 1997, including extensive outreach development work leading up to this event. This development work has become an important integral part of the work in the host area prior to the Festival and the company intends to continue this work.

#### FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS cont'd

The company will be submitting an application to the Lottery, New Directions in the Autumn of 1997 for funding over a three year period starting in April 1998 in order to enable the company to become a youth dance development agency for Scotland.

# 1996 SCOTTISH YOUTH DANCE FESTIVAL - 6th-13th JULY

The 1996 Scottish Youth Dance Festival (SYDF) was hosted by Dumfries and Galloway Council and was based in Dumfries and was part of the Burns bi-centenary celebrations. Additional funding came from the Scottish Arts Council and various sponsors and charitable trusts.

#### **FESTIVAL**

The aim of the Festival is to bring together young people aged 14 upwards from around Scotland and beyond with professional tutors to broaden their skills and celebrate their common enthusiasm for dance through a week long residential programme of classes, workshops and performances. SYDF actively encourages the participation of young people with disabilities in all its activities.

Over 160 people were involved in the Festival. There were 105 young participants (two being non-residential), 18 group leaders, 2 young musicians from Dumfries, 10 liaison staff and 33 other members of staff - tutors, musicians, technicians, performers, etc. There were 16 groups at the Festival, including new groups from Trafford, Aberdeen and Dundee. There were 6 young people from Dumfries & Galloway attending the Festival, with over 20 others from the area coming to perform during the week.

The Festival prides itself in providing young people of all abilities with the opportunity to participate, perform and share in a relaxed, non-competitive environment and we believe this was achieved to a high standard in Dumfries. Artistic Director for the 1996 Festival was Winifred Jamieson and she was joined by an impeccable collection of tutors who understood the ethos of the Festival and threw themselves wholeheartedly into all aspects of the week. The quality of the teaching and the sheer energy that was expended, enthused and thrilled the young people. Under the musical direction of Christopher Benstead the musicians worked endlessly to provide quality accompaniment and wonderful compositions for the sharing. During this Festival, as with last year's the young people were given the opportunity to take part in creative sessions which combined various artforms and technology. These projects have become more popular and it is a priority for SYDF to continue to provide access to new ways of making dance. A Youth Leaders' Course was an integral part of the week.

## **OUTREACH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME**

An extensive Outreach Programme took place in Dumfries and Galloway which had a profound effect on youth dance in the area. This outreach programme culminated in three exciting Evenings of Community Dance in June 1996 in Lockerbie, Castle Douglas and Dumfries. Scottish Youth Dance Festival has been successful in attracting further funding locally in the area in order to continue the work started in 1996 and now have an established youth dance group in the area.

#### SUPPORT

Dumfries and Galloway Council, Dumfries and Galloway Arts Association and Groundbase provided support for the Festival and the Directors would like to thank them all for this commitment. There was a great deal of community involvement in the Festival in 1996, not only in the outreach programme but in the Festival itself.

We were pleased with the newspaper and television coverage of the Festival which was very complimentary and supportive and we feel that our profile as a key national dance event was maintained.

#### FUNDING

Funding for the 1996 Festival came from 4 main funding bodies - Dumfries and Galloway Council, Dumfries and Galloway Arts Association, the Scottish Arts Council and Groundbase, the local enterprise company. The Festival also received minor support from several local authorities on a general approach as a national organisation, and from several charitable trusts and private firms.

#### SPONSORSHIP AND DONATIONS

The directors would like to thank the following for their support of the Festival: Marks & Spencer, the Russell Trust, the Scottish International Education Trust, the Gannochy Trust, the Baring Foundation, the Save and Prosper Educational Trust, the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, the Hugh Fraser Foundation, the Esmee Fairbairn Trust, the Educational Institute of Scotland, Inveresk plc, the Mitchell Trust, the Gordon Fraser Charitable Trust and the Royal Mail.

### **CONCLUSION**

The Scottish Youth Dance Festival once again provided a focal point in the Scottish dance calendar and offered young people the opportunity to come together to share and celebrate their skills, ideas and achievements. The outreach development work was very successful and the newly established groups are continuing to work together.

#### **CONFERENCE**

Scottish Youth Dance Festival ran a one-day Conference on Monday 10 March in collaboration with Dundee College, Dundee and based at Northern College in Dundee and funded by the Scottish Arts Council. The Conference brought together 89 people to share ideas and experiences. The dance tutors, presenters and musicians were highly skilled and experienced and the Conference was chaired by Jenna Agate. The presentations were very well received and were well balanced and presenters very articulate and informative. All three workshops were clearly and sensitively taught. The sessions catered extremely well for the range of groups and the response was very positive.

#### CONCLUSION

Scottish Youth Dance Festival is pleased to have run this successful Conference and Dundee College should be applauded for its support. SYDF is keen to build on the success of this event and in 1997/8 to run a longer event, as in Alloa in 1995, culminating in a Conference.

The overwhelming response to the day from the delegates was to provide increased opportunities for workshops, training, debate and networking. SYDF will continue to develop and promote events of this quality and importance.

#### OTHER EVENTS/THE FUTURE

In addition to the above, over the last year the company has run youth leaders' training courses, including one in collaboration with Telford College in Edinburgh; an Easter School for young people in collaboration with Dance Base in Edinburgh; an outreach youth dance development programme in Dumfries following the work initiated at the 1996 Festival; acted as an information and advice resource for youth dance throughout the year.

Plans are well underway for the 1998 Festival which will take place in Irvine, North Ayrshire and the 1999 Festival which will provisionally take place in Shetland. Scottish Youth Dance Festival is now poised to further develop its role and become a Youth Dance Development Agency for Scotland and the company will endeavour to raise the extra funding needed for this development over the next year.

# ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS ON THE UNAUDITED ACCOUNTS OF SCOTTISH YOUTH DANCE FESTIVAL

We report on the accounts for the period ended 31 March 1997 set out on pages 8 to 13.

## Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

# SCOTTISH YOUTH DANCE FESTIVAL NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### 1. COMPANY STATUS

The Company is a charity limited by guarantee.

## 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### a. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the company's operations which are described in the Directors' Report and all of which are continuing.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

#### b. Interest Received

Interest is credited to the Income and Expenditure Account when received.

### c. Grants and Donations

Grants and donations are credited to the income and expenditure account in order to match with expenditure for the period. Grants and donations received relating to a future festival are deferred with an element released to the income and expenditure account to match with the costs of set up of the future festival.

### d. Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rate in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Office Equipment - 25% reducing balance

#### 3. REVENUE PRESENTATION

In order to give a clearer picture of the Company's activities the Revenue Account departs from the statutory format laid down by the 1985 Companies Act. In particular, the headings of Turnover, Cost of Sales, Gross Profit are not appropriate to the circumstances of the company. The statutory accounts have not fully followed the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting by Charities because the directors are of the view that the layout as shown adequately reflects the financial position of the charity. In the opinion of the directors all expenditure other than that disclosed as Management and Administration as detailed at Note 5 is correctly disclosed as charitable.
