### **DIRECTORS' AND MEMBERS' REPORT**

### 31ST MARCH 2003

The directors and members have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the charity for the period from 1st April 2002 to 31st March 2003.

### The principal objectives of Dundee Women's Aid are:

to encourage the provision of temporary refuge for women and their children. Where a woman has been abused (mentally, physically or sexually) in her home or by a man with whom she is or has been in a relationship. Women's Aid provides a service for abused women whether or not they have children.

to offer support, information and help to women and their children who ask for such help, whether or not they are refuge residents, and also to offer support and information to any woman and child who have left a temporary refuge.

to provide equal opportunities for, and participation of, women in society to enable them to determine their own futures.

to provide opportunities to meet the educational and emotional needs of children, particularly those resident in refuge, of women using the services of Dundee Women's Aid.

to encourage statutory authorities and other agencies to recognise their obligations, legal and otherwise, towards abused women and their children and to act accordingly towards the prevention of abuse and relief of suffering.

to promote education and to inform the community and their representatives including the media, the police, the judicial system, the social services and other authorities with regard to the abuse of women and its prevention.

to encourage research into the causes, the prevention and relief of such suffering and abuse.

### **Principal Activities**

Dundee Women's Aid provides its direct service to abused women through its office in 61 Reform Street, Dundee which is open Monday, Thursday and Friday from 10am to 4pm and Tuesday 2pm to 4pm. Phone cover is from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday (ansaphone only on Tuesday morning). From 5pm to 10pm Monday to Friday and weekends 10am to 10pm there is an on call system in operation. Safe accommodation is provided if required and as available in the three refuges which provide a total of 14 family spaces. There were 861 contacts to Dundee Women's Aid during the year. 152 requested refuge accommodation and of these 89 women and 90 children were admitted to the refuges. The support and information office and the refuges are the core of the work along with the services to children provided by the two children's workers. This service is provided by paid and also unpaid workers.

Other principal activities are:

### Follow on

A three year community funded project started in September 2002 to provide support for women and also for children who leave refuge. We have been able to offer this service to women who have suffered abuse and are re-housed from the Homeless Unit. This has been a much welcomed development.

Other principal activities (continued)

### **Training**

The Domestic Abuse Service Development Fund post was renewed for a further 2 years and training to agencies has been a priority of the year with a mixture of full day in-depth and shorter basic awareness training being delivered.

### **Hopscotch**

11 children enjoyed a weekend away funded by Hopscotch. 3 workers bravely undertook the task and came back with tales of gondola rides, visits to sea-life centre and tramps in the rain-the weather failing to dampen the children's spirits.

### Summer Playscheme

Thanks to Children in Need two children's workers were employed for the summer holiday period to provide a full programme of play sessions and outings.

### Scottish Women's Aid Network

Dundee Women's Aid is a member of the Scottish Women's Aid Network, valuing the opportunities to share expertise and to engage in development of the service. The network structure has undergone considerable reorganisation and Dundee Women's Aid has been active in the process.

### Multi-agency work

The Domestic Abuse Service Development Fund post was renewed for a further 2 years and so delivering training to agencies has continued to be developed. An additional project similarly funded is a research post with the worker also having a role in developing the Domestic Abuse Forum.

### **Future Developments**

The most exciting new development is of a purpose built refuge, scheduled for summer 2004. This will provide 7 two bedroomed flats and a communal area and replace 5 spaces in shared accommodation.

Planning for this and for registration with the Care Commission are high priorities for the next year.

Establishment of support groups for women and also for children who have been re-housed. Development of service delivery training to agencies based on the new Scottish Women's Aid training materials.

Dundee Women's Aid will endeavour to continue to provide a high quality of service to women and any accompanying children who have experienced domestic abuse. We will continue to be active members of the Scottish Women's Aid Network.

### **Business Review**

The company's balance sheet as detailed on page 5 shows a satisfactory position, accumulated funds amounting to £48,001.

### Results

The results for the year are shown in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 4.
