# Review of the Year

As Redwoods entered its 20<sup>th</sup> year, we continue to be inspired and envisioned by the faithfulness and creativity of God. His passionate desire is to lavish His love on each person.

The name of Redwoods was of course taken from the Giant Redwoods Tree – another of God's incredible creations.

Names are very significant and represent many qualities and attributes – as we consider the attributes of the Redwoods tree, we see -

- the crown of the tree is conical pointing upwards
- the branches droop slightly giving protection below
- the bark is resilient even to fire
- the roots are shallow and wide spreading very tolerant to drought
- the tree lives long
- the tallest and oldest trees live in the valley beside streams
- the tree is evergreen

In Redwoods we see, on a daily basis, many of these attributes in both the people we support and the staff themselves.

Over the last year many have experienced difficult personal circumstances which they have faced with resilience, determination and grace – and they have won through.

Two people, George and Gordon, whom Redwoods had been privileged to know and care for over the last 10 years, died last year. We are so grateful to God that He gave us the wonderful opportunity to be a part of their lives. They had both lived long!

Once again we have marvelled at accomplishments which have been attained by both the people we support and staff.

Borders College Accreditations have been awarded to a number of people at the Day Centre. Others have been to college to attend courses – but probably more importantly experience new surroundings and challenges – and again they have won through. For some people the accomplishment has been staying away from home for the first time on a short break in The Beeches, or making Ash Lea their new home. However large or small the accomplishment, we witness daily resilience, strength and determination in the lives of the people we support. However we honour everyone for who they are rather than what they have accomplished.

The staff teams have both individually and corporately attained much. Many staff have accomplished SVQ awards, from levels 2 to 4, and we honour their endeavour. Staff teams have worked with people to see them succeed in whatever they want to do: they facilitate holidays for people who want to have a break; they give care and support 24 hours per day, 365 days per year – and we esteem them for their commitment both to the people and to the outworking of God's promises. They, like the branches of the Redwoods tree, provide shelter and protection.

The staff teams are led by motivated, dynamic, compassionate managers, whose standards of leadership have undoubtedly led to Redwoods being awarded *Investor in People* in December 2005. Whilst we are delighted with this accomplishment we recognise that we have a God who invested all of himself in us and our response to that is to replicate it in Redwoods.

We have experienced drought, particularly in relation to funding, but just as the Redwoods tree can withstand drought, Redwoods, through God's provision, still stands.

The China Wall Challenge was accomplished and Redwoods is most grateful for the funds (£10,000) it realised which, along with other generous donations and legacies have meant that significant progress has been made in the development of the Music & Activities Project.

So, in the last year we have experienced some situations that are akin to fire, and God's protection on Redwoods has been very evident. We have experienced some drought, yet since God designed the root system of Redwoods it has withstood the circumstances. We have seen people continue to flourish and we recognise that this is due to God's continued nurture and care for each person.

### **Finances**

We continue to receive the majority of our funding from Social Work Departments, but this year has seen a significant rise in fundraising, particularly for the Music & Activities Project. We are hugely grateful to all those, both individuals and trusts, who have given donations.

This year has seen an overall surplus of £33,534, with an overall increase in net assets to £619,717.

# **Future Developments**

As we consider the future, we are looking forward to realising the opening of the Music & Activities Facility, which we know will reflect the creative attributes of God.

Much around us is changing – new ways of working, new arrangements for providing care, new regulations. The same is true of the Redwoods tree, but the central fact remains that we are both designed and created by God. We, like the crown of the Redwoods tree, will continue to look up, to God, for He sustains Redwoods and we know His love, faithfulness and grace will prevail.

The charity is a Company limited by guarantee, and is constituted by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. A board of directors, who meet regularly throughout the year, administer the charity.

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# Risk Assessment & Reserves Policies

# Risk Assessment

The Redwoods Caring Foundation has undertaken an assessment of the principal risks to which we are exposed, and has taken action to mitigate such risks.

# Reserves Policy

The Redwoods Caring Foundation does not have a separate reserve fund, and has no investments other than those required for direct service provision, including the purchase of land and buildings and other capital assets. Cash balances are held in the bank as working capital.

Each service unit is treated as a separate restricted fund. When new services are introduced they will not have a surplus income and may need to be supported from central funds, however a surplus may be built up gradually over time. We consider that each unit should ideally hold within its own funds sufficient cash balances to cover 3 months budgeted income, since the unit may have to cover the cost of protracted client vacancies as well as exceptional staff and other costs. We consider 3 months budgeted income to be sufficient for this purpose, and where the balance exceeds 3 months income, a portion of the excess may be transferred to any other fund within The Redwoods Caring Foundation as required. This is also to comply with the Charity Commission's requirement that any funds held are being used in the most effective way to further the charity's objectives.

All land and buildings owned by Redwoods are held as part of the unrestricted assets, apart from new developments, which must be held as distinct restricted funds for such time as they are the subject of specific fundraising. A major part of the income to unrestricted funds comes from management charges on the service units, and provided that there are sufficient reserves in the service units to cover any client vacancies, this is reasonably predictable. The expenditure from unrestricted funds is, however, subject to a considerable level of uncertainty, since it is necessary to meet, for example, the cost of building repairs, which cannot all be planned in advance.

In order to provide new services, bank or mortgage borrowing will often be necessary, to fund part of the cost. It is not considered necessary to retain a positive cash balance in unrestricted funds, since these are offset by the capital value of buildings, on which capital could be raised if necessary by mortgage, or, should any service unit be discontinued, by sale.

It is, however, considered prudent to restrict the total amount of borrowing by Central Services to 50% of the book value (market value) of assets held as land and buildings.

# Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

# Independent Auditor's Report to Members

For the year ended 31 March 2006

I have audited the financial statements of The Redwoods Caring Foundation (Company Limited by Guarantee) for the year ended 31 March 2006 set out on pages 7 to 13. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities and the accounting policies set out from page 10.

# Respective Responsibilities of Directors and Auditors

As described in the Statement of Directors' Responsibilities the charitable company's directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

I report to you to give you my opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. I also report to you if, in my opinion, the Directors' Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the charitable company has not kept proper accounting records, if I have not received all the information and explanations I require for my audit, or if information specified by law regarding directors' remuneration and transactions with the charitable company is not disclosed.

I read the Directors' Report and consider the implications for my report if I become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

### Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charitable company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I planned and performed my audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming my opinion I also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

In my opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the charitable company's affairs at 31 March 2006, and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, in the year then ended. They have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 March 2006

# 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material to the Company's affairs.

### a) Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### b) Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are stated at cost and are written off over their estimated useful lives on a straight line basis at the following rates:

Freehold land and buildings

2%

Leasehold improvements

Over the length of the lease

Furnishings and equipment

25%

Motor Vehicles

25%

#### c) Income

Income comprises funding from central and local government, plus donations and grants and other income derived from fundraising. All income is credited to the Profit and Loss Account in the year it is received.

#### d) <u>Taxation</u>

The Redwoods Caring Foundation has been given charitable status and exemption from Income Tax under Section 505 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988.

#### e) Refurbishment Expenditure

In order that the Net Book Value of Redwoods House remains in line with the current market value, all expenditure on the refurbishment of Redwoods House during 1993 and 1994 was charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the year it was incurred. During the period 1995/96 part of the refurbishment costs incurred were capitalised in line with the increased market value.

There is a Standard Security in favour of the Secretary of State for Scotland for the grant provided for the refurbishment of Redwoods House to the sum of £267,843 if Redwoods ceases to provide residential care accommodation within 15 years from May 1995. This security is postponed to the Bank of Scotland.

As a result of this unexpired grant a realisable value of £290,000 may be stated, to reflect the potential liability under this security.

It should be noted that balances carried forward on each unit are not cash balances, but part of the capital funds tied up in the fixed assets required to run the unit.

A transfer has been made from the Paisley Drive restricted fund to unrestricted funds, in line with the charity's Reserves Policy
