Report of the directors for the year ended 31 December 2011

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011.

Results and dividends

The profit and loss account is set out on page 5 and shows the loss for the year.

Principal activities, review of the business and future developments

The principal activity of the company is that of land and property investment in the United Kingdom.

The company is a member of the group headed by Regenco Properties LLP.

During the year under review the group continued its property investment activities and in particular continued the process of seeking to secure suitable planning permission for its strategic land sites.

During the year, the development at Winchburgh has progressed well and most of the key uncertainties referred to in the previous year's report and financial statements have been resolved. Since the year end the s75 agreement with West Lothian Council has been signed, variations to the terms of the loan notes and the option agreement to acquire further land have been signed and the group has secured contracts with two house builders for the development of the first residential phase comprising 178 new homes.

The Winchburgh development represents one of the UK's single largest residential and mixed use developments with planning. The development area, located eight miles west of Edinburgh, includes plans for the construction of 3,500 new homes, five new schools, a town centre, town park, retail facilities and a commercial park, as well as associated infrastructure such as a new motorway junction and train station, including 'park and ride' facilities. Work on site commenced in July 2012.

Having taken into account the above external factors, the directors of the company were satisfied with the performance of the company during the year under review.

Details of events since the balance sheet date are set out within the notes to the financial statements.

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

Cash flow statement

The company has used the exemption under Financial Reporting Standard 1, "Cash Flow Statements", not to prepare a cash flow statement as the directors believe that the company is a "small entity" as defined under section 382 of the Companies Act 2006.

Land and properties under development for investment

Land and properties acquired for the purposes of investment, including associated costs, are carried at cost during the course of their development, less any provision for impairment. No depreciation is provided during the course of development.

Dividends

Equity dividends are recognised when they become legally payable. Interim equity dividends are recognised when paid. Final equity dividends are recognised when approved by the shareholders.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the company anticipates making sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences.

Deferred tax balances are not discounted.

The intermediary controlling entity of the company is Regenco Properties LLP, which is the parent of the smallest group of which the company is a member and for which consolidated accounts are prepared and are filed at Companies House.

The immediate controlling entity of the company is John Cadzow (Glendevon) Limited.

14 Post balance sheet events

Since the balance sheet date the following transactions have taken place:

- On 20 March 2012 and 21 March 2012, the company signed agreements with trustees of the Winchburgh Trust to transfer legal ownership of the land beneficially owned by the company.
- On 23 March 2012, the company was part of a group reorganisation which has resulted in the company's land interests being transferred to Regenco Trading Limited at their book value.
