NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2001

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000).

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures & Fittings

20% straight line

Computers

25% straight line

Office Equipment

- 20% straight line

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Deferred taxation

Provision is made, under the liability method, to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purposes and their treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred or accelerated is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences to the extent that it is considered that a net liability may arise.

On 6 August 2001 the company came under the control of Edinburgh Television Festival Council after the previous council split into two separate entities.

Included in 'turnover' is an amount of £50,000 being a donation received from the Edinburgh Television Festival Council for the Young People's Television Festival (a strand of the TV Festival specifically for young people).

Included in 'interest payable and similar charges' is a Gift Aid Declaration of £120,152 to the holding company (in the previous year £153173 was paid under Deed of Covenant.)
