Report of the Directors

For the year ended 31 October 1994

The Directors have pleasure in presenting their report for the year ended 31 October 1994.

Constitution

Edinburgh Headway Group was incorporated in April 1992 as a company limited by guarantee and on 26 May 1992 acquired the net assets of the Edinburgh Headway Group, a trust which had been formed in 1982. It has received permission from the Registrar of Companies to omit the word "limited" from the company name.

Executive Committee

Directors

The directors during the year were as shown on page 1.

J D M Urquhart and D Duncan retire by rotation, and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

Co-opted Members

During the year W Bryden, Miss K MacPherson and AWF White were co-opted as members of the committee until the Annual General Meeting, and are eligible for re-appointment by the Board of Directors.

Statement of Directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the surplus or deficit of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:-

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Report of the Directors

For the year ended 31 October 1994

State of affairs

During the year under review the Group's deficit as disclosed in the Income and Expenditure Account amounted to £4,051 (1993 - Surplus £6,466), which has been transferred to General Fund.

Activities

It is the intention of the Group to carry on the rehabilitation of persons who have suffered traumatic head injuries and to provide care and support for such persons, their relatives and carers. To carry out this work the Group will continue to provide a full programme of activities and therapy sessions.

Auditor

A resolution to re-appoint A B Dobson & Co CA as Auditor of the Group will be submitted to the members at the Annual General Meeting.

Auditors' Report to the Members

For the year ended 31 October 1994

We have audited the financial statements on pages 5 to 10 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 7.

Respective responsibilities of director and auditors

As described on page 2 the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board, except that the scope of our work was limited as explained below.

An audit includes the examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. However, the evidence available to us was limited because £11,729 of the company's recorded income comprises voluntary donations and certain other receipts which cannot be fully controlled until they are entered in the accounting records and are therefore not susceptible to independent audit verification. While we are satisfied with the treatment of recorded receipts there were no practicable audit procedures by which we could determine that all receipts have been properly recorded.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Qualified opinion arising from limitation in audit scope

Except for any adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning voluntary donations and certain other receipts, in our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 October 1994 and of its surplus for the year ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

In respect alone of the limitation on our work relating to voluntary donations and certain other receipts: We have not obtained all the information and explanations that we considered necessary for the purpose of our audit.

Notes to the Accounts

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting, are in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom and comply with Statement of Recommended Practice 2 - Accounting by Charities.

As allowed by paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 4 to the 1985 Companies Act the directors have, due to the special nature of the company's business, adapted the prescribed format for the Income and Expenditure account.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset evenly over its expected useful life as follows:-
