INTRODUCTION

Enterprise Music Scotland aims to represent and support the work of all bodies and individuals involved in the promotion of chamber music in Scotland. The main source of income is Creative Scotland. The company makes grants to music societies and other groups with the aim of encouraging concerts and recitals of chamber music as well as offering support to musicians and composers involved in the production of chamber music.

LEGAL STATUS

Enterprise Music Scotland is a company registered in Scotland and Limited by Guarantee. It was established in 1992. Enterprise Music Scotland is also a registered charity.

OBJECTIVES

The charitable purposes of the company seek to advance the education of the public in all aspects of chamber music and to give support to the musicians providing it.

ORGANISATION

The membership of the company is currently made up of organisations and individual Directors dedicated to the promotion of music in Scotland. The Board of Directors consists of representative directors nominated by the member organisations and co-opted directors nominated by the Board.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2012

In addition to regular meetings of the whole Board of Trustees, there are various sub-committees of the Board members which meet to run specific activities of the organisation's work in conjunction with the General Manager and his support staff.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In the year ended 30th September 2012, the company supported 73 music clubs who provided 495 concerts with a total audience of 49,995. The support for all events is in general very satisfactory.

Enterprise Music Scotland continues to receive substantial investment from Creative Scotland for its chamber music activities. In addition to this core funding, we have enjoyed additional grant funding for the successful Chamber Music Matters international conference held in May 2012, the Chamber Music Day which was held on 15th September 2012 and for bringing chamber musicians under our banner following the demise of the Chamber Music Forum.

We have continued to expand the activities of EMS within the constraints of the funding available to us and our education of children continues to expand and our Residency Project continues to be popular.

The introduction of musicians has forced the Board of Directors to review our Memorandum and Articles of Association and bring them up to date to reflect current activity. Changes in qualification for membership are also being proposed at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting to ensure that the future management of EMS will be in the safe hands of the Board.

Enterprise Music Scotland continued to assist Creative Scotland with the management of grants for traditional music, drama and storytelling for a second year.

The Board continues to examine its own development and management on a regular basis. The Executive Committee met on four occasions during the year as did the full Board. Enterprise Music Scotland continues to employ a dedicated part time staff who are instrumental in the promotion of our objectives.

FINANCIAL CONTROLS

The finances of the organisation are controlled by the Executive Committee consisting of four members of the Board. Monthly management accounts are maintained and presented at every Board meeting. The Board continues to monitor possible risks facing the company and has procedures to manage them. The Board has retained sufficient financial reserves to enable the short-term continuation of activities, or an organised run-down of activities, should our main source of funding be unexpectedly withdrawn.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees (who are also the directors of Enterprise Music Scotland for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2012

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the trustees must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and the income and expenditure of the charitable company for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- · make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Web site costs and equipment

25% per annum straight line

Grants provided

Grants are recorded as they are paid. In respect of the unrestricted funds grants, any funds not distributed at the balance sheet date are held within creditors in the accounts. In respect of the Restricted Funds, the balance held for future grants and budgeted costs, is held as Restricted Funds within the Balance Sheet.

Grants received

Unrestricted Funds grants are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis. Restricted Funds grants are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities to match the Grants Provided and the relevant budgeted costs.

Income from the Scottish Tours Book

Income relating to the Scottish Tours Book is included in revenue in the period in which the book is published.

Other Income

All other income is credited to the Statement of Financial Activities in the year to which it relates.

Allocation of income

All other income except for grant income is allocated to unrestricted income funds unless there are restrictions attached to the income where upon it is allocated to restricted funds.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2012

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. Where possible, expenditure has been charged direct to charitable expenditure, cost of raising funds or governance costs. Where this is not possible the expenditure has been allocated on the basis of time spent by staff on each activity. Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.

Allocation of expenditure

Expenditure incurred in furtherance of the charities objects is charged to unrestricted funds unless that expenditure is made from restricted income in which case it is charged to the respective restricted fund.

Governance costs are allocated entirely to unrestricted funds.
