#### INTRODUCTION

Enterprise Music Scotland Limited aims to represent and support the work of all bodies and individuals involved in the promotion of chamber music in Scotland. The main source of income is Creative Scotland. The company makes grants to music societies and other groups with the aim of encouraging concerts and recitals of chamber music as well as offering support to musicians and composers involved in the production of chamber music.

#### **LEGAL STATUS**

Enterprise Music Scotland Limited is a company registered in Scotland and Limited by Guarantee. It was established in 1992. Enterprise Music Scotland Limited is also a registered charity.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The charitable purposes of the company seek to advance the education of the public in all aspects of chamber music and to give support to the musicians providing it.

#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

#### YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2013

#### **ORGANISATION**

The membership the company is currently made up of organisations and individual Directors dedicated to the promotion of music in Scotland. The Board of Directors consists of representative directors nominated by the member organisations and co-opted directors nominated by the Board.

In addition to regular meetings of the whole Board of Trustees, there are various sub-committees of the Board members which meet to run specific activities of the organisation's work in conjunction with the General Manager and his support staff.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

In the year ended 30 September 2013, the company supported 75 music clubs who provided 536 concerts with a total audience of 45,559. In addition we organised education workshops and introduced children to chamber music.

Enterprise Music Scotland continues to receive substantial investment from Creative Scotland for its chamber music activities through our core funding grant and additional to this we are able to apply for further funding for appropriate non core activity. However, we have managed to fund some of this ourselves through better financial management and utilisation of some of our reserves.

Following the Special General Meeting last year, the Trustees are now the members of Enterprise Music Scotland and they are well aware of the need to ensure that there is a spread of talent and experience which can be seen to be representative of all those who are Registered Interest Parties.

Creative Scotland increased the amount of money available for Tradarts this year from £80,000 to £120,000 and we continue to manage the allocation of these funds on their behalf between music storytelling and dance.

During the year a new logo and website were created and the latter enabled us to reorganise the production of the very popular Tours Book and this is now available online. The money we were able to save enabled us to have another very successful Chamber Music Day in September 2013.

The Board continues to examine its own development and its management of the company. Much progress has been made during the year with assistance from part time staff based in Glasgow and the intelligent post box service from The A9 Partnership Limited.

#### **FINANCIAL CONTROLS**

The finances of the organisation are controlled by the Executive Committee consisting of four members of the Board. Monthly management accounts are maintained and presented at every Board meeting. The Board continues to monitor possible risks facing the company and has procedures to manage them. The Board has retained sufficient financial reserves to enable the short-term continuation of activities, or an organised run-down of activities, should our main source of funding be unexpectedly withdrawn.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September 2012 set out on pages 6 to 15.

#### RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2013

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

#### **Fixed assets**

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Web site costs and equipment -

25% per annum straight line

#### **Grants provided**

Grants are recorded as they are paid. In respect of the unrestricted funds grants, any funds not distributed at the balance sheet date are held within creditors in the accounts. In respect of the Restricted Funds, the balance held for future grants and budgeted costs, is held as Restricted Funds within the Balance Sheet.

#### **Grants received**

Unrestricted Funds grants are credited to the Income and Expenditure Account on an accruals basis. Restricted Funds grants are credited to the Income and Expenditure Account to match the Grants Provided and the relevant budgeted costs.

#### Income from the Scottish tours book

Income relating to the Scottish Tours Book is included in revenue in the period in which the book is published.

#### Other Income

All other income is credited to the Statement of Financial Activities in the year to which it relates.

#### Allocation of income

All other income except for grant income is allocated to unrestricted income funds unless there are restrictions attached to the income where upon it is allocated to restricted funds.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2013

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. Where possible, expenditure has been charged direct to charitable expenditure, cost of raising funds or governance costs. Where this is not possible the expenditure has been allocated on the basis of time spent by staff on each activity. Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.

#### Allocation of expenditure

Expenditure incurred in furtherance of the charities objects is charged to unrestricted funds unless that expenditure is made from restricted income in which case it is charged to the respective restricted fund.

Governance costs are allocated entirely too unrestricted funds.

During the year the company paid £1,033 (2012 - £1,694) to the trustees. This was mainly for travel expenses to attend company meetings and workshops. None of the trustees received any remuneration.
