NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 25 FEBRUARY 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Woollen Mill (Edinburgh) Limited (the "Company") is a company incorporated and domiciled in the UK.

These financial statements are drawn up for the 52 week period ended 25 February 2017.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' and the Companies Act 2006. The amendments to FRS 101 (2014/15 Cycle) issued in July 2015 and effective immediately have been applied

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 101 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgment in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 2).

In preparing these financial statements, the Company applies the recognition, measurement and disclosure requirements of International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU ("Adopted IFRSs"), but makes amendments where necessary in order to comply with Companies Act 2006 and has set out below where advantage of the FRS 101 disclosure exemptions has been taken.

The change has enabled the company to take advantage of all of the available disclosure exemptions permitted by FRS 101 in the financial statements, the most significant of which are summarised below.

The financial statements are prepared on the historic cost basis.

The company's financial statements are presented in Sterling and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand pounds (£000) except when otherwise indicated.

The principal accounting policies adopted by the Company have been applied consistently throughout the period.

The company's ultimate parent undertaking, The Edinburgh Woollen Mill (Group) Limited, includes the company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of The Edinburgh Woollen Mill (Group) Limited are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and are available to the public and may be obtained from Companies House, 4th Floor, Edinburgh Quay 2, 139 Fountainbridge, Edinburgh, EH3 9FF.

1.3 GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis notwithstanding the net liabilities of £47,000 at 25 February 2017 (2015 - £38,000). The company is dependent for its working capital on funds provided by group companies. The company's ultimate parent undertaking, The Edinburgh Woollen Mill (Group) Limited, has indicated that for at least twelve months from the date of approval of these financial statements or, if shorter, for as long as the company remains a wholly owned subsidiary of the ultimate parent company, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the company to pay its liabilities as they fall due and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. The directors consider that this should enable the company to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment. As with any company placing reliance on other group entities for financial support, the directors acknowledge that there can be no certainty that this support will continue although, at the date of approval of these financial statements, they have no reason to believe that it will not do so.

Based on the undertakings from The Edinburgh Woollen Mill (Group) Limited, the directors believe that it remains appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result from the basis of preparation being inappropriate.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 25 FEBRUARY 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.4 TAXATION

Tax is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, except that a change attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

2. JUDGMENTS IN APPLYING ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates.

The directors do not consider there to be any significant judgements made in the application of the accounting policies.

3. AUDITOR'S REMUNERATION

The companies audit fees have been borne by the parent company. The company has taken advantage of the exemption not to disclose amounts paid for non-audit services as these are disclosed in the group accounts of the ultimate parent company.

4. EMPLOYEES AND DIRECTORS REMUNERATION

The Company has no employees other than the directors, who did not receive any remuneration (2016-£NIL).

No directors' emoluments were incurred in either period. The directors did not provide any material qualifying services to the Company. All directors who served during the year were employed by The Edinburgh Woollen Mill Limited and were remunerated through that Company. Retirement benefits are accruing to one directors (2016- one) under a group defined benefit pension scheme and one director (2016- one) under a group defined contribution scheme.

Factors that may affect future tax charges

A reduction in the UK corporation tax rate from 21% to 20% (effective from 1 April 2015) was substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. Further reductions to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) and to 18% (effective 1 April 2020) were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015, and an additional reduction to 17% (effective 1 April 2020) was substantively enacted on 6 September 2016. This will reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly.
