REPORT of the DIRECTORS/TRUSTEES

The trustees present their report and financial statements for the period ended 31 March 2022

Directors/Trustees

The Directors of the charitable company are its trustees for the purposes of charity law. Throughout this report they are referred to as the trustees. The trustees/directors who served during the year have no beneficial interests in the company, which is limited by guarantee and as such has no share capital.

Structure Governance and Management

Outspoken Arts Scotland Limited is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Trustees are recruited and appointed by the Board of Directors. The company is also a Scottish Charity

Principal Activities/Trustees Report

The work of the charity in 2021-2022 continued to be affected by the worldwide Corona Virus Pandemic, also known as Covid-19. This particularly continued to affect cultural venues, galleries, theatres, concerts hall and community venues which remained closed well into 2021. Additionally retail premises faced restrictions from the prior year lasting until 26th April 2021.

The Company secured a temporary licence to occupy of a shop unit in the Piazza Shopping Centre, Paisley. On lifting of retail restrictions in April, the space, Unit 37, the Company opened as Artspace37 for the showing of The Scottish Drawing Competition, a programme of Creative Learning workshops, and a number of solo artists town centre installations. The programme supported several hundred artists, attracted 1200 visitors, and all free workshops were fully booked by local community participants. It was notable that after 18 months of restrictions, people were keen to get back out into society, to events and to take part again in cultural activities.

The Company had planned an autumn exhibition programme and a further programme of creative learning workshops in the space. However, the temporary licence from Edinburgh Printmakers was terminated in July 2021. At this time office working was still restricted to home working until 8th August. The staff team returned to its Abbeymill office base on 16th August and began transforming the space into a creative learning centre for the visual arts accommodating up to 20 participants.

A programme of workshops was set for Sep/Oct/Nov in drawing, painting, collage, textiles, and pottery. These free workshops attracted a large number of participants and were, once again, fully subscribed by local people.

During the year, the following projects were supported:

- The Paisley Suite, five new monologues by Scottish writers Premiered on YouTube in August 2021
- Artspace37 development of a new gallery space in the Piazza, Paisley.
- Artwork Workshops a programme of 32 online workshops in the visual arts
- Town Centre installations programme 3 out of 5 planned activities took place between May-July 2021.

The Company maintained a high social media following of 49,403 – across Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Issuu, Mailchimp and website, reaching 240,082 readers.

In February 2022 the company signed a two-year licence to occupy agreement for the former Allders Department Store in Causeyside Street, Paisley. The site will allow the company to radically expand its exhibition, performance and creative learning programmes and act as a venue and creative hub for local community groups and related arts activity. The unit is part of a major redevelopment of the Paisley Shopping Centre earmarked for leisure, retail, residential, and health & well-being services. The Company's plans are supported by PACE Theatre Company, National Theatre of Scotland, & Future Paisley.

The Charity continues to be supported by Creative Scotland, Renfrewshire Council and a host of donors and sponsors.

Directors/Trustees' Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the surplus and deficit of the company for the period. In preparing those, financial statements the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and the apply them

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) Statement of Recommended Practice issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005), The Compnaies Act 2006, Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2006 and Regulation 8 of The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006

Cash Flow Statement

The Directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (as revised) from including a cash flow statement in the Financial Statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

Government Grants and Resources Expended

Government grants which are deemed to be revenue in nature are credited to the profit & loss account as they become receivable.

Where awards are made for specified projects they will be treated as restricted funds pending their appropriate usage. Costs will be allocated directly to the specified projects where possible, Where appropriate costs which are incurred on more than one specified activity will allocated proportionately.

Grants of a Capital nature are released to the Income and Expenditure Account over a 3-4 year period.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged at the following rates

Fund Accounting

All of the funds received by the Charity are used for developing the core objectives of the organisation. When appropriate additional restricted funds and designated funds will be separately accounted for.

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Directors/Trustees in furtherence of their Charitable objectives, unless the funds have been designated for other purposes.

9 Contingent Liability

Shortly after the company took over the former Alders department store in the Paisley shopping centre significant bills were raised by the energy supplier which were clearly excessive. While the matter is not fully resolved all current indications are that the bills will be made void. It appears that the charges arose as a result of faulty equipment.
