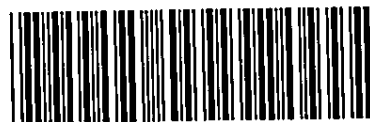

Independent auditor's report to CH2M Hill IDC (UK) Limited

Pursuant to Section 449 of the Companies Act 2006

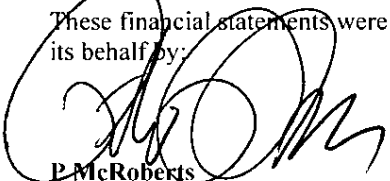

Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules.

The company is dependent on ongoing financial support from the ultimate parent company. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the ultimate parent company has given an undertaking to provide financial and other support to the company to enable it to continue to trade for the foreseeable future.

Fixed assets and depreciation

All assets with a useful life extending beyond one year with a unit cost of greater than £3,000 are capitalised and depreciated over their useful lives. All expenditures less than £3,000 are expensed as incurred.

All property expenditures, including tenant improvements, are capitalised if the individual expenditure is greater than £5,000.

Depreciation is provided by the company to write off the cost less the estimated residual value by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives, as follows:

Office Equipment	-	3 years straight line
Software	-	3 years straight line

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Provision is made for deferred tax only to the extent that it is probable that an actual liability will crystallise.

Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement available to wholly owned subsidiaries under FRS 1.

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of goods and services to customers during the year.

Pension costs

The company contributes to a defined contribution group personal pension scheme in respect of eligible employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The amount charged against profits represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting year.

Leases

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account over the life of the lease.

Share based payments

The share option programme allows employees to acquire shares of the Company. The fair value of options granted after 7 November 2004 and those not yet vested as at 1 January 2009 is recognised as an employee expense with a corresponding increase in equity. The fair value is measured at grant date and spread over the period during which the employees become unconditionally entitled to the options. The fair value of the options granted is measured using an option pricing model, taking into account the terms and conditions upon which the options were granted. The amount recognised as an expense is adjusted to reflect the actual number of share options that vest except where forfeiture is only due to share prices not achieving the threshold for vesting.

For cash settled share based payment transactions, with the exception of those awards settled before 1 January 2009 the fair value of the amount payable to the employee is recognised as an expense with a corresponding increase in liabilities. The fair value is measured at grant date and spread over the period during which the employees become unconditionally entitled to payment. The fair value is initially measured at grant date and spread over the period during which the employees become unconditionally entitled to payment. The fair value is measured based on an option pricing model taking in to account the terms and conditions upon which the instruments were granted. The liability is revalued at each balance sheet date and settlement date with any changes to fair value being recognised in the profit and loss account.
