Objectives and activities

The charity's objectives are to provide an independent, free and confidential advice service to the general public in the Nairn area.

During the year the company continued to provide advice on a range of matters including financial advice.

DIRECTORS' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

Achievements and performance

This financial year has been pretty much a stable year in which my fellow board members and I have taken the opportunity to consolidate on what we have achieved to date and financially plan a way forward for the next 2 years and beyond. A stringent budget has been set for the years ending 31 March 2010 and 2011 respectively during which we hope to increase opening hours and staffing levels to take Nairn CAB to an even higher level of excellence and service provision.

This year we received additional funding to increase support for Welfare Rights provision (to a total of 30hrs) which was split over 2 members of staff. The increased work that this brought into the Bureau also resulted in a review of staffing requirements and job descriptions and it was deemed as from December 2008 a Deputy Manager was required.

Highland Council were once again the core funders and funding also continued to be received from IASS. The IT and computer infrastructure was upgraded thanks to donations of £2,500 each from The Rotary Club and The Davidson Trust. The CAS Development Fund donated £3,287 to allow the Bureau's carpet to be completely replaced throughout the building. May I take this opportunity to thank our main funders and our project funders for their generous support throughout the year.

Financial review

The results for the year show an overall surplus of £7,750 (2008 - £19,184).

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The directors consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

To ensure that reserves are maintained at this level, in accordance with conditions in the service delivery contracts with Highland Council, the council have made a one off payment of £15,000 to the charity which the charity must hold as reserves. This amount is included in restricted funds.

Plans for the future

Moving forward, Nairn Citizens Advice Bureau Limited is in a strong financial position to deliver its service to the population of Nairn, and the next 2 years will see the Bureau increase opening hours, ensure paid members of staff are working the correct hours to support the volunteers and the Bureau opening hours, and with 2 other separately funded projects coming on board we will increase the Bureau's outreach further into the community and beyond. Many thanks to my fellow Directors for their support and also to the paid members of staff and volunteers of Nairn Citizens Advice Bureau for their continued hard work and their delivery of excellent impartial advice to the population of Nairn.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 1985.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources including grants are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

There were no donated assets received by the charity. No amounts included in the financial statements are for services donated by volunteers.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements. As the charity is not registered for VAT all expenditure includes irrecoverable VAT where appropriate.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

1.5 Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.
