DIRECTORS REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

The directors have pleasure in presenting their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2012.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 25 February 1997. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Directors of the company are appointed by the members at the AGM and are responsible for the general management, control and direction of the bureau. Directors are also able to opt members to be directors should a vacancy arise during the year. Officers of the company are appointed by directors at the first board meeting after the AGM. Directors are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. Recruitment procedures are in place to ensure that new trustees appointed meet certain conditions and criteria and constitute the widest possible representation of the community served by the bureau. Induction procedures are also in place to ensure that new directors participate fully in bureau affairs. The current 8 Board members meet on a regular basis. In addition the bureau manager, 2 volunteer representatives and 1 staff representative also attend the board meetings. Day-to-day management of the bureau is delegated to a team of 4 full-time and 3 part-time staff led by Gillian MacLean, bureau Manager. Generalist advice is supplied by 35 volunteer advisors with 5 volunteers offering part time admin support.

None of the directors has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the directors are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The directors have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The aims of the Citizens Advice service are firstly to ensure that individuals do not suffer through ignorance of their rights and responsibilities, or of the services available, or through an inability to express their needs effectively and secondly to exercise a responsible influence on the development of social policies, both locally and nationally.

The Charity's objectives are to provide independent, free, confidential and impartial advice, information, and representation services that are readily accessible by and tailored to meet the needs of the local community. During the year the company continued to provide advice on a range of matters including welfare benefits, money advice, employment, housing advice, tax and consumer issues.

A 3 year business plan has been developed and objectives and activities are aligned to achieving the strategic goals of the bureau. Regular monitoring reports are submitted to the board to assess the achievement of the organisation's objectives.

DIRECTORS REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

This year has seen a further rise in the number of clients accessing our service. We have had almost 6,000 contacts addressing almost 13,000 issues. In order to meet this demand we have recruited 12 new advisers. More than £1.9 million has been brought into the local community through Client Financial Gain across the service.

Thanks to stringent budget planning and successful bids for funding we have been able to increase Money Advice provision to 32 hours per week: a much need additional service for the people of Nairn and surrounding district. This has proved essential as the levels of debt continue to rise and the Money Advice Team have dealt with more than £2 million worth of debt in the last year.

Early intervention by specialist housing and employment advisors has been shown to reduce the number of clients facing eviction, repossession and employment tribunals. Not only does this have a huge economic benefit for the country as a whole, it reduces the anxiety of the clients. Through the joint project with Moray CAB, funded by the Scottish Legal Aid Board (SLAB), we have been able to continue to provide a specialist employment adviser who is able to represent clients at Employment Tribunals or through the new Judicial Mediation process. SLAB is also funding a Housing Specialist post which again enhances the service we can offer to the people of Nairn and district.

A successful bid for funding, to Citizens Advice Scotland, has enabled Naim CAB to deliver Best Energy Deal session: information and signposting sessions to 75 energy customers and front line workers.

Funding for the Armed Services Advice Project, originally a two year project funded across three Highland bureaux by Poppy Scotland, has been extended until June 2013. In excess of 200 clients have been helped by this project.

Highland Council were once again our core funders and funding continues to be received from NHS Highland for IASS until March 2012.

May I take this opportunity to thank both main and project funders for their generous support throughout the year.

DIRECTORS REPORT (CONTINUED)

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The results for the year show an overall surplus of £1,610 (2011 - £37,440). At the end of the year unrestricted funds carried forward total £37,368 and restricted funds stand at £75,922. In addition to the unrestricted surplus there is a one off payment of £15,000 from Highland Council which is held in restricted reserves to cover a significant drop in funding and will cover in emergency three to six months current activity expenditure.

In these uncertain times to maintain our current service levels a proportion of the unrestricted funds have been incorporated into use for the 2011/2012 budget year. The directors consider that the current level of reserves ensure that, in the event of a drop of funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funding may be raised.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Moving forward, Nairn Citizens Advice Bureau Ltd has core funding secure until the end of March 2013. Project funding will continue to be sought to continue current projects and to add to our existing services.

The Highland Council have still to reach a final decision on whether the current CAB services across the Highlands are to be put out to tender or negotiated on a mutually agreeable basis. The contractual structure in which the services are provided may therefore change, however, the directors are committed to maintaining the current service and are of the opinion that any new structure will not affect the services provided.

Many thanks to my fellow Directors for their support. Their expertise and tireless effort has built firm foundations for the future of the bureau as we face the challenging times ahead. Thanks also to the staff and volunteers who continue to work hard to deliver an excellent service to the people of Nairn and surrounding areas.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, The Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

Incoming resources

All Incoming resources including grants are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be qualified with reasonable accuracy.

There were no donated assets received by the charity. No amounts included in the financial statements and for services donated by volunteers.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with the administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements. As the charity is not registered for VAT all expenditure includes irrecoverable VAT where appropriate.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
