# Report of the Directors For the Year Ended 31 March 2020

The directors are pleased to present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2020.

#### Structure, Governance and Management

Transform Scotland is a company limited by guarantee, with the liability of members limited to £1 each. The company (referred to as the "Charity") is governed by the terms of its Articles of Association and is a registered Scottish charity. The membership is made up of organisations from public, private and voluntary sectors from each of which a representative is appointed.

The directors are elected by the membership at the AGM. At each AGM, directors who, as at the date of that AGM, have been in office for three years or more shall retire but may be eligible for re-election at that meeting.

The Board of Directors creates a strategic and policy framework for the Charity, focuses on strategic direction and vision and is ultimately responsible for ensuring that the organisation fulfils its statutory requirements.

The names of members of the Board of Directors during the year are shown on page 2 together with other reference and administrative information.

#### Objectives and Review of Activities

Transform Scotland is the national alliance for sustainable transport. We campaign for walking, cycling and public transport to be the easiest and most affordable options for everyone. Our diverse membership brings together public, private and third sector organisations from across Scotland. We are a registered charity, politically independent and strictly science-based.

The Charity's principal objectives are the promotion of sustainable development policies and practices for transport, and the education of the public on the impact of transport on the environment and society.

During the course of the year, we carried out a range of activities which advanced the case for sustainable transport, focusing mainly on Scottish Government and Scottish Parliament processes. We were represented on a number of working groups of the Government's National Transport Strategy Review, and made representations on Strategic Transport Projects Review 2. We provided written and oral evidence to the Parliament on the UK Climate Change Commission's report & the Climate Change (Emissions Reduction Targets) (Scotland) Bill. We provide the secretariat to the Parliament's Cross-Party Group on Cycling, Walking & Buses.

We welcomed the Scottish Government's declaration of a Climate Emergency, but contrasted this with ongoing national infrastructure priorities which continued to favour high-carbon expenditure. We worked with bus and rail industry members to promote decarbonisation and modal shift towards these modes. We completed the #lovemybus project, working in tandem with Stagecoach West Scotland, to promote bus travel. We worked with Edinburgh Napier University Transport Research Institute on a research project on zebra crossings. We worked to promote car-free cities, holding an event on the topic in Glasgow, and prepared a report for publication.

Our two social enterprises 'Transform Consulting' and 'Transform Creative' continued their work. Highlights included: creating a brand and website to launch the Environmental Port Index, a new tool from Norway to improve the environmental performance of international ships and ports; leading research for Cycling Scotland into the scope of access to bike schemes in Scotland; and designing a series of case studies, publicity materials and guidance documents for Living Streets Scotland's Walking Connects project to increase the wellbeing of older adults through walking. Other clients included the Coalition of Care and support Providers in Scotland, CoMoUK, Paths for All, Community Land Scotland, Scotland's International Development Alliance, Social Enterprise Scotland, Strathclyde Partnership for Transport, Diabetes UK and Virgin Trains.

We continued to engage in a wide range of sustainable transport policy and practice (including active travel, bus, tram, rail and ferry policy; aviation; land use planning; rail freight; road maintenance; slower speeds; tourism; and the Scottish Budget process). We have responded to numerous policy consultations, provided written and oral evidence to parliamentary inquiries, and met with a wide range of public, private and third sector stakeholders.

We engaged in advancing Scottish rail policy via ScotRail's Stakeholder Advisory Panel and the Scottish Government's High Speed Rail Scottish Partnership Group. Furthermore, we remain engaged in a number of other alliances including the European Federation for Transport and Environment, Edinburgh Social Enterprise Network, and Social Enterprise Scotland.

Our work has been accomplished in large part through the voluntary efforts of our Board of Directors plus a range of interns and volunteers who have been instrumental in carrying out our research, campaigns and communications work.

At the time of approving this report, Scotland, along with the rest of the world was experiencing the Covid-19 pandemic and since March 2020, restrictions were imposed on almost all facets of daily life. Transform Scotland responded by continuing to work and successfully moving staff to on-line working from home, with only one member of staff being furloughed. Meetings have been held by videoconference.

A new project, similar to the #lovemybus campaign was due to start in the current financial year but has been delayed until late autumn. The ongoing Zebra Crossings project was also affected and implementation has also been delayed. However, our funders have been very understanding of the impact on the projects and have worked with us to minimise the disruption.

Income for the 2020-21 year has not been adversely affected and the level of unrestricted funds has been maintained.

#### Financial Review

Income and expenditure is detailed in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 6.

The income for the year was £255,872 and expenditure was £164,051 resulting in a surplus of £91,821 at the end of the year.

Transform Scotland has agreed a policy of holding reserves of around £43,000 to cover costs in the event of having to close due to the organisation being no longer financially sustainable. The Board reviews its reserves policy each year with a view to ensuring that the level of reserves held is appropriate. This figure had been achieved by the end of the year and the general fund stood at £122,654 (see note 8).

#### Small Companies Provisions

This report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions in Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 applicable to companies subject to the small companies' regime.

# Independent Examiner's Report To the Directors of Transform Scotland

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2020 which are set out on pages 6 to 12

#### Notes to the Accounts

#### **Accounting policies**

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)' - (referred to as 'the Charities SORP'), the 'Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (FRS 102), the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015. The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has applied the alternative structure for smaller charities allowed by paragraph 4.22 of the Charities SORP and has not reported on an activity basis. Similarly, as a smaller charity, a cash flow statement has not been prepared.

#### Incoming resources

Grants and donations are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which they are receivable, provided any conditions for use of the grant or donation have been fulfilled. Where a grant or donation is received for a specific purpose, it is included within restricted income and any unexpended portion carried forward as a restricted fund. Contractual income and performance related grants are only included once the charity has provided the related goods or services or met the performance related conditions.

#### Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis.

#### Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is calculated by the straight line method to write off the cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful lives at the following rate:

Office equipment & furniture: 25% per annum

#### Debtors

Debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due.

#### Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised, at settlement amount, where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event, which is likely to result in the transfer of funds to a third party, and the amount due can be measured or estimated reliably.

#### **Fund Accounting**

Unrestricted funds arise from donations without a specified purpose and other income generated and are available to be used for any of the objects of the charity at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support

#### **Pensions**

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions are charged to the income and expenditure account as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.
