

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2000

The Directors, as Trustees of the Charity, have pleasure in presenting their Report and Financial Statements of Clan Sinclair Trust for the year ended 31 December 2000.

The results for the year are presented in a form to comply with the revised Statement of Recommended Practice for charities, as issued by the Charity Commission in October 1995 and as identified in the Charities Act 1993.

This Directors' and Trustees' Report and full accompanying Financial Statements are published and distributed to all members in accordance with statutory regulations for registered companies.

Legal and Administrative Details

The legal and administrative details are listed on Page 1.

Objects

The Trust is established for the purpose of the preservation and promotion of Sinclair and Girnigoe Castles; for the promotion of the history of the Castles and the Sinclair Clan; and the establishment of a visitor centre.

Organisation

The Trust was incorporated on 4 March 1999 under the name of Sinclair and Girnigoe Castle Trust and recognised by the Inland Revenue as a Scottish Charity on 19 March 1999. The Trust changed its name to Clan Sinclair Trust on 19 October 1999 to reflect its wider objects.

Review of the Development, Activities and Achievements of the Trust during the Period

Royal Patron

Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, graciously accepted the office of Patron of the Trust.

Preservation and Promotion of the Castles

The legalities of the transfer of the Castles to the Trust were completed this year

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT (Continued)

FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2000

Following meetings with Historic Scotland, plans were submitted to and agreed by Historic Scotland for Ancient Monument consent for the works to be carried out to stabilise the detoriations of Girnigoe Castle. The Trust's application for grant to help with the cost of the work, estimated at £1 million, was submitted to the Heritage Lottery Fund.

Following meetings in New York and London an application has been submitted to the World Monument Fund for inclusion in their 2002 list of the most endangered sites worldwide. This list is published every two years and contains 100 properties worldwide that the Fund considers being in most danger of being lost and worthy of retention. Naturally the competition is extremely fierce to be included on the list and usually only two or three properties from the UK become successful.

Promotion of the history of the Castles and Sinclair Clan

This year saw the First International Gathering of the Clan, which took place in London, Edinburgh and around Caithness. Over 160 Sinclairs from the United States of America, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and Sweden took part. Everyone on the trip was given a guided tour of the Castles and Lachlan Stewart, the Trust's architect, explained the plans. The promotional value of the Gathering — and the goodwill it generated locally, as well as with those who took part — will benefit the Trust in the future. It has also formed a solid base for a better understanding and relationship amongst the Trust and the clan worldwide.

• Establishment of a Visitor Centre

The Clan Sinclair Study Centre was completed last year in time for the International Gathering. The Niven Sinclair Library, forming part of the Study Centre, now houses the books and other artefacts gifted to the Trust and part of the Library was furnished with the Trust's financial assistance. The Library was officially opened during the Gathering by the eponymous Niven Sinclair.

The owner, Noss Head Estates Limited (in which Ian Sinclair, a Director of the Trust, has a material interest) had offered to sell the Study Centre to the Trust at value, but this was clearly impossible due to the Trust's current financial position. The Trust continued negotiation with Noss Head Estates Limited and agreed to rent part of the Centre for office purposes. An independent valuer acceptable to both parties determined the rental value.

Finance

Approval has been given in the United States of America by the IRS for US citizens to donate to the Trust in a Tax efficient manner and this has already proved helpful in securing donations.

As anticipated in last year's Report fundraising both in the UK and overseas suffered as a result of the time commitment given by the Earl of Caithness to organising and running the Gathering. Nevertheless two useful visits were made to the USA and one to Australia. The interest in the project if growing and the Gathering confirmed the belief that potential donors really need to see the Castles personally, to better appreciated their splendour and their plight.

As also anticipated in last year's Report the Trust now has a trading subsidiary called Sinclair Bay Trading Company Ltd. It is being mainly run through the clan website www.clansinclair.org by Euan Sinclair, a Director. The range of goods for sale will be expanded as finance permits.

The Trust continues to restrict its expenditure and the Directors have borne a lot of the costs of their work for the Trust personally.

Future Plans

The determination of grant application to the Heritage Lottery Fund will help the Directors to decide the programme for the coming year. The Trust will instruct further work to be carried out by the Architects and the Engineers in consultation with Historic Scotland.

New approaches for funding will be made and existing contacts followed up.

The result of the application to the World Monument Fund for inclusion in their 2002 Watch List will not be known until Autumn 2001. If successful, this will be of great importance to the Trust.

Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires the Directors to prepare Financial Statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those Financial Statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the Financial Statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2000

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
