ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

At Craigiebarns the majority of the damage caused by the flood has been repaired. The new carpets have been laid and fitted and extensive electrical and computer configuration work has taken place. The CCP has been repaired and is now connected to the siren and the WB1400. The Royal Observer Corps Association regularly use the bunker for their meetings and often supply a sizeable contingent at the work weekends. The fire detection system is fully operational and because of this regular organised tours now take place. The Perspex map boards have been hand drawn by a skilled cartographer which has brought to life the Sector Operations Room.

Dudley Police Post has been the target of repeated break ins and vandalism. Community Police are keeping an eye on the property but with limited success.

The nuclear bunker in Govan is in good condition internally and externally but the landscaping needs attention.

We are still waiting on funds to complete the last police box restorations. They are currently in storage a Chapelhall Police Station.

In the coming financial year 2017/2018

The following plans are being put in place

- 1 To continue to open Craigiebarns to the wider public after the success of the open days.
- 2 The setting up of a separate charity by Gavin Saxby and his team for the day to day running of the bunker. Gavin has retired as a Director of this trust to concentrate his time and effort solely on Craigiebarns Bunker. We thank Gavin for his time, knowledge, enthusiasm and expertise in all things electronic. He will certainly be missed by us but he is certainly the right man for the job at Craigiebarns.
- 3 To repair the damage at Dudley Police Post caused by the vandalism and break ins and to continue to liaise with West Midlands Police to provide the best security cover for the post.
- 4 Protracted negotiations with Thames water for the last four mark III police boxes in the UK are continuing.
- 5 With the help of the volunteers at Dundee we hope to have some work days at Govan Bunker and complete the landscaping work.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the requirements of the Statement of recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the ground that the company is small.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the independent examiner's fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the sofa on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource.

Fixed assets
