ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Craigiebarns is now being run in its entirety buy a new charity "28 Group Observed SCIO". Made up of Gavin Saxby (formerly of this Trust) and his team at Craigiebarns. Gavin left the Civil Defence & Emergency Service Preservation Trust to take up this role and concentrate on opening and running Craigiebarns as a public museum and so far things are going really well with regular tours and working equipment and apparatus. The Trust's relationship with the Royal Observer Corps continues and they still regularly use the bunker for their association meetings and participate in Gavin's now legendary work weekends keeping the bunker watertight and ship shape with an extensive repainting program having been undertaken in this financial year. The cartographer has also finished his epic reinstatement of the Group Control & Sector Control Perspex map boards, a massive feet and something the whole team can be proud of.

Dudley Police Post is still proving problematic with regular vandalism and the cost of driving down to asses and carry out the repairs, not ideal. A community use would certainly be beneficial as we feel if it was regularly used it would deter the attacks.

The ROC post in Shieldhall has been cleaned and painted and is still in pretty good condition.

The last Police Box is still waiting final restoration, lack of funds slow its progress but it is safe and secure and will see a new home at some point.

My poor health has also slowed projects down this year, no cash has transacted through the Trust this year with all work carried out by volunteers and Craigiebarns now part of the accounts with "28 Group Observed SCIO" has resulted in no money being spent this year.

In the coming financial year 2018/2019

The following plans are being put in place

- 1 To liaise with Glasgow City Council to find a suitable location for the last Gilbert McKenzie Trench Police Signal Box to be located.
- 2 To continue to work with our partner charity "28 Group Observed" in their running of Craigiebarns Sector HQ Nuclear Bunker and the fantastic work they carry out there.
- 3 To continue supporting bunker tours at Craigiebarns and continue to invite secondary school in Dundee and Angus.
- 4 Protracted negotiations with Thames water for the last four mark III police boxes in the UK are continuing.
- 5 To monitor repairs and find a community use for Dudley police post.
- 6 To asses underpinning for the porch and repair brickwork at entrance to Craigiebarns Bunker
- 7 To ascertain the possibility of obtaining a light fire appliance for use at Craigiebarns Bunker

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the requirements of the Statement of recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the ground that the company is small.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional statutory requirements of the charity and include the independent examiner's fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource.

Fixed assets
