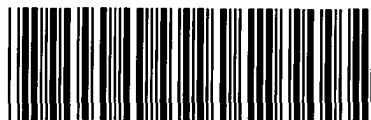

**OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

**Objectives and aims**

The objects of the company are as follows:

The advancement of education as regards the marine environment of the United Kingdom;

The advancement of education of those engaged or to be engaged in fishing activities in the seas around the United Kingdom;

The advancement of health and the saving of lives in relation to those engaged or to be engaged in fishing activities in the seas around the United Kingdom;

The advancement of science and the heritage and culture of the United Kingdom as regards the protection, preservation and stewardship of the marine environment, promotion of the conservation of marine living organisms and preservation of the marine ecology and biodiversity of the seas around the United Kingdom; and

The advancement of environmental protection and improvement including the sustainability of marine living organisms as regards the seas around the United Kingdom.

In 2015 the Trust received consent from the Scottish Charity Regulator OSCR to add a sixth object. This process is now complete and the new object is:

The provision of welfare services and facilities for fishermen and fishing communities.

**ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

**Charitable activities**

Net grant awards made in 2015 totalled £126k. Awards included: further support for the Seafood Scotland 'Seafood in Schools' project; the latest in the series of SFF observers joining the Marine Scotland Science monkfish survey; a contribution towards the Scottish Pelagic Fishermen's Association 'Pelagic Scientific Support' project and part-funding of gear trials facilitated by the industry led and Scottish Government supported Gear Innovation and Technology Advisory Group (GITAG).

Funding was also approved for several heritage projects including a Clyde Fishermen's Association commissioned fisheries documentary, the 125 Memorial Association sculpture at Eyemouth and the Invercairn Community Council memorial statue.

There continued to be good demand for qualifying training courses, including from active fishermen upgrading their non-mandatory certification. The Trust also supported a further graduate placement at the NAFC Marine Centre and the updating of safety equipment at North East Fishermen's Training Association. Grants continued to be made available for the enhancement of stability records for fishing vessels involved in guard vessel work.

A donation of £50k was received from SFF Services Limited, the Federation's wholly-owned subsidiary marine services company.

**FINANCIAL REVIEW**

**Reserves policy**

The bulk of the income of the Trust is by way of annual donation from SFF Services Ltd. The funds are mainly used to provide grants for marine related projects with awards being restricted to the availability of funds after basic administrative costs have been covered.

**Principal funding sources**

The principal source of funding was by way of a donation totalling £50,000 (2014, £100,000) from SFF Services Ltd.


**FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of  
Scottish Fishermen's Trust**

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2015 set out on pages five to ten.

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. **Basis of the independent examiner's report**

My examination was carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.


**Independent examiner's statement**

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2015

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

##### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with a sufficient degree of accuracy.

##### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

##### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

##### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
