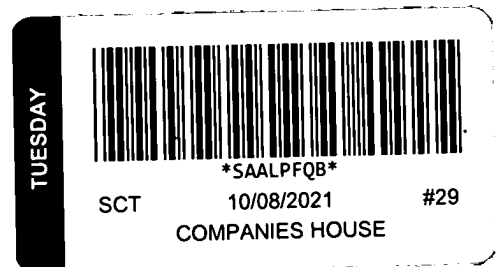

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**Report of the Trustees
for the Year Ended 31 December 2020**

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

INCORPORATION

The charitable company was incorporated on 6 October 1999 and commenced trading on the same date.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the company are as follows:

The advancement of education as regards the marine environment of the United Kingdom;

The advancement of education of those engaged or to be engaged in fishing activities in the seas around the United Kingdom;

The advancement of health and the saving of lives in relation to those engaged or to be engaged in fishing activities in the seas around the United Kingdom;

The advancement of science and the heritage and culture of the United Kingdom as regards the protection, preservation and stewardship of the marine environment, promotion of the conservation of marine living organisms and preservation of the marine ecology and biodiversity of the seas around the United Kingdom; and

The advancement of environmental protection and improvement including the sustainability of marine living organisms as regards the seas around the United Kingdom.

The provision of welfare services and facilities for fishermen and fishing communities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Grant awards made in 2020 totalled £14,182. However, a number of projects for which funding had previously been allocated were completed and the full funding was not required. This resulted in the reversal of the surplus awards balances. The total of the reversals was £23,761 giving a net awards credit for the year of £9,579.

The 2020 activities of the Trust were affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. On 11 May 2020, the Trustees took the decision to temporarily close the General Fund to applications, given the uncertainty being experienced and to allow the Trustees to reassess the Trust's priorities when the full impact of the pandemic was better known. OSCR, the Scottish Charity Regulator, was informed. Small awards continued to be made available from existing restricted and ring-fenced funds. The General Fund reopened to applications on 6 August 2020, with a cap of £2,000 per application per party.

Awards included support for The Swan Trust to part-fund the replacement sails on the 1900-built Shetland Fifie Swan. Smaller awards were made to: the Marine Conservation Society for their 'Ocean Education Roadshow'; Remote Expedition Scotland for a survey of 'Marine Vessel Presence and its Impact on Marine Mammal Abundance Between South-East and South-West Harris'; Scottish Fishermen's Federation for the attendance of an eminent scientist at the ICES benchmark meeting to discuss cod and whiting in area VI; and NAFC Marine Centre for the 'Comparisons of survey data for cod' project.

An award was also made to the Fish Industry Training Association (Highlands & Islands) Ltd, to fund essential items needed to deliver First Aid training courses in a manner compliant with Scottish Government Covid-19 protocols.

The Trust continued to support active fishermen during their non-mandatory Certificate of Competency studies. The first of the training grants for the Mk3 FishSAFE unit were awarded. Grants continued to be available for the enhancement of stability records for fishing vessels involved in guard vessel work, although there were no applications in 2020.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The principal source of funding was by way of a donation totalling £25,000 (2019:£25,000) from SFF Services Limited which is gratefully acknowledged.

Reserves policy

The bulk of the income of the Trust is by way of annual donation from SFF Services Limited. The funds are mainly used to provide grants for marine related projects with awards being restricted to the availability of funds after basic administrative costs have been covered.

FUTURE PLANS

The Trust hopes to continue making available grant funding for marine projects in the years ahead.

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of


Independent examiner's statement

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The Financial Statements have been prepared in UK '£' sterling.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charitable company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when the amount receivable can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally on actual receipt of interest or where a fixed rate of interest has been agreed on a specified term deposit.

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the profit and loss account in other administrative costs.

The purpose of each restricted fund is as follows:

The Guard Vessel Stability Fund was established in 2009 to help the owners of vessels engaged in guard vessel duty to produce enhanced stability records.

The Guard Vessel Stability Fund 2 was established in 2013 to help the owners of vessels engaged in guard vessel duty to refresh their stability records in the event of a material change in the vessel's stability.

Cold water and PFD Appreciation Training was established in 2018 for this purpose. A separate unrestricted fund for the same purpose was also created during the 2018 financial year with an opening balance of £3,600 by way of transfer from the unrestricted General Fund.

9. MOVEMENT IN FUNDS - continued

The Advancement of Marine Science and Conservation Fund was established in 2011 for this purpose. During the 2019 financial year an award of £2,600 was cancelled and the provision which had been created for it previously was released, resulting in a credit through the Statement of Financial Activities. The funds will be held for future projects within this category.
