Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2008

The Trustees are pleased to present their Report together with the Consolidated Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2008.

Status of Charity and Governing Document

Cove Park ("the Charity") is a company limited by guarantee (No: SC201042, incorporated 26 October 1999) and is therefore governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. It is a registered Scottish charity, reference number: SC029530. The wholly owned subsidiary, Cove Park Enterprises Limited, is a company registered in Scotland (SC200626).

All of the above are also trustees of the charity, with the exception of Dr Alexia Holt.

Appointment of Trustees

New Trustees are appointed as and when required by the Charity's needs. Appointment is through a process of criteria that has been agreed upon by the current Trustees, and the period of appointment is in accordance with the Articles of Association. New trustees are provided with information which aims to familiarise them with the charity's values, aims and objectives, together with its day to day operations in addition to clarifying their statutory responsibilities as directors of a company limited by guarantee and trustees of a charity.

Administrative Structure

The trustees meet around three times throughout the year to discuss the operations of the charity, while the day-to-day running of the charity is delegated to Dr Alexia Holt, with the support of the other directors.

Statement of Risk

The Trustees continually review and assess the major strategic, operational and financial risks to which the Charity is exposed. From this review, the Trustees continue to update and establish procedures to mitigate those risks which are identified as a result. Main risks that have been identified are:

- Direction and Forward Planning of the Charity
- Control of Charity Assets
- Personnel
- Financial Management & Controls

For each of these risks, procedures have been put in place to mitigate and reduce the associated risk.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2008 (cont)

Charitable Objectives

The primary aims of the charity are to advance the education of the public in all aspects of contemporary artistic practice by:-

- providing individuals with time, space and freedom to undertake significant research, develop their practice/(s) and ideas, or produce new work;
- providing an annual programme of residencies and activity to facilitate collaboration, exchange, networking and dialogue between individuals and across art forms including individuals working in the arts, including visual arts, performance creative and critical writing, music, theatre, film and video, photography and crafts, and creative industries including the fields of design, architecture, media, communications and digital technology,
- working in partnership with key individuals and organisations within Scotland, the UK and abroad, to ensure Cove Park maintains an international role and profile;
- ensuring that Cove Park continues to develop, engage and involve a breadth of audiences in its activities including practitioners and the broader public; and
- ensuring that Cove Park remains a site of outstanding natural beauty.

Achievements and Performance

In 2008 Cove Park supported 72 national and international artists during a programme that began in April and ended in December of that year. Residencies of between one week and six months were awarded to emerging and established artists working in the visual and performing arts, crafts, design, literature, music and critical writing.

Enabling leading artists to undertake significant research and develop ambitious new projects, Cove Park's 2008 residency programme was complemented by a series of professional and public events that allowed a broad public to see and experience the work being produced on site and to meet the artists. This aspect of our programme was enhanced significantly in 2008 through the development of two conferences, devised by the artists, which focussed on specific themes within contemporary practice. Readings, performances, recitals and Open Studios events all contributed to the variety of public programme presented by Cove Park during the year.

Cove Park's innovative Artists in Schools education programme entered its fifth year in 2008. Visual artists, and former Cove Park residents, devised imaginative new projects for students in the region's secondary schools (students who, given the geographical challenges of Argyll and Bute, have few opportunities to see contemporary art or to work alongside professional artists). This programme is a vital means of providing professional opportunities for artists and making Cove Park accessible to young people in Scotland.

Scottish Arts Council Residencies

The Scottish Arts Council (SAC) increased its support in 2008 to enable Cove Park to award five three month residencies in crafts, literature and the visual arts and, for the first time, two six-week residencies. The six-week residencies enabled Cove Park to support Scottish artists in the fields of creative and critical writing and the visual arts.

Henry Moore Fellowship

Cove Park awarded its first six-month Henry Moore Fellowship to the acclaimed Mexican visual artist Abraham Cruzvillegas. Developed in partnership with Glasgow's Centre for Contemporary Art (CCA), this residency enabled the artist to produce a new body of work which was shown in a major solo exhibition at the CCA in September 2008. The catalogue, 'Autoconstrucción', was also produced.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

Visual Arts Creative Development

The Esmée Fairbairn Foundation funded the second year of a major new four-year programme: Visual Arts Creative Development. Six six-week residencies were awarded to five established visual artists and one critical writer/curator. This programme is unique in the UK and provides a focus not only for individual research and the development of new projects, but also for a programme of talks, studio visits and presentations that act as a platform for discussion and exchange among participating artists.

Jerwood Residencies

With support from the Jerwood Charitable Foundation, Cove Park created valuable one and two-week residencies for leading UK theatre producers, directors, playwrights, choreographers and theatre companies. This programme included Irina Brown, Stephen Brown, Creased, Graham Eatough, Fuel, Liz Lea, Dominique Le Gendre, Joana Seguro and Theatre 503.

Poet to Poet Translation

Cove Park's Poet to Poet Translation programme entered its fourth year in 2008. With support from Colmcille, Hi Arts and the Golsoncott Foundation, Cove Park created five one-week residencies involving Irish and Scottish Gaelic writers.

Music

In 2008, Cove Park developed two new commissions: the first was a collaboration between UK composer Larry Goves and Psappha ensemble; the second a collaboration between Armenian composer Stepan Rostomyan and Paragon ensemble. Rostomyan's piece will premiere at the Huddersfield Contemporary Music Festival in 2009 and will then be performed at Armenian Perspectives XXI, Yerevan.

Jewellery and Silversmithing Residency

The third Jewellery and Silversmithing residency was awarded to the UK-based Taiwanese silversmith Chien-Wei Chang.

Argyll and Bute Residencies and Artists in Schools

Cove Park is one of only a small number of contemporary arts organisations based in Argyll and Bute. This, coupled with the challenges presented by the geography of the region, means that the local community has few opportunities to engage directly with contemporary art. The ongoing development of our public programme, the Argyll and Bute Residencies (aimed at artists based in the region) and the Artists in Schools programme, are all key ways in which Cove Park can help to address this lack of provision and create opportunities for a wide audience to engage with our programme.

The Emerging Artists Programme

With support for the first time from the Foyle Foundation, Cove Park was able to develop significantly its support of emerging artists and to enhance the former Springboard programme of residencies. In 2008, we awarded six residencies not only to visual artists and makers, but also to promising composers and musicians.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

Other Projects and Developments

Building upon the success of the first Cove Park Commission in 2007 (awarded to the internationally acclaimed visual artist Simon Starling), Cove Park invited the visual artist Graham Gussin in 2008 to develop a new project for Cove Park. Research towards this project, which will enable the development of new work produced in response to and for the Cove Park site, began in 2008 and led in the same year to a Henry Moore Foundation (New Commissions and Projects) Award for 2009.

Throughout the year, Cove Park also worked in partnership with a number of leading national arts organisations, helping to facilitate a broad range of projects: Edinburgh College of Art, Glasgow School of Art and Glasgow University (Department of Theatre, Film and Television). We also worked with the artists Ilana Halperin and Douglas Gordon on projects where Cove Park provided the facilities and site for the development of new work.

In February 2008 Cove Park appointed its first full-time General Manager. This vital post has enhanced significantly the day-to-day management of Cove Park and has improved the experience of all artists and visitors involved in our programme.

We are pleased to have attracted new support in 2008 from several leading UK Trusts and Foundations and hope to continue to work with these organisations in the future. In 2008 we also launched a new scheme, under the title of Cove Park Associates, through which former residents can support the development of our programme. We appreciate this support enormously.

Future plans

Our ambition is to continue to build upon the success of the programme to date and to develop new ways of supporting the development of contemporary artistic practice. The SAC awarded Cove Park Flexible Funding in 2008 and this increased level of support, committed for the first time for two years, will benefit our 2009 programme significantly.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2008 (cont)

Future plans (continued)

From 2009, we hope to expand our international programme. Awards made in 2008 from both the Daiwa Anglo-Japanese Foundation and the Sasakawa Foundation will enable a research visit to Japan in 2009 to develop a new visual arts residency exchange programme for 2010 and 2011.

Our ability to develop the programme, within a challenging financial context, hinges upon the success of our long term fundraising strategy: both via maintaining and developing our existing partnerships and by seeking new sources of income. In 2008 Cove Park was awarded an Organisational Development Award from the Scottish Arts Council. This award has enabled Cove Park to appoint for one year in 2009 Roanne Dods (formerly Director of the Jerwood Charitable Foundation) as a consultant with the specific brief to develop voluntary support for Cove Park and which is intended to result in an increase in private giving of all kinds.

Cove Park will also continue to develop plans for a major capital programme. This involves the development of a new building which will replace the existing Centre and be commensurate with the aims, scale and ambition of our current and future artistic programme, and, in particular, to fully exploit the potential of our education and community programmes.

We will also look forward to 2010 and the ways in which Cove Park can celebrate ten years of its residency programme. For this year we plan a series of events that will celebrate not only the work achieved to date by Cove Park, but also the work produced and developed by artists of international standing as a direct result of their residencies.

Financial Review

For the second year, the results comprise the consolidated accounts of Cove Park and its wholly owned subsidiary Cove Park Enterprises Limited. The results and balances of the subsidiary are included in the consolidated financial statements as unrestricted funds.

The consolidated gross income for the year was £348,356, with £17,599 coming from charitable activities. There was a consolidated net deficit for the year of £4,032, however this is cushioned by the profitable sale of portfolio works through Cove Park Enterprises Limited during the year, the results of Cove Park Enterprises Limited contributing a net profit of £3,976 to the overall result.

The financial statements show a consolidated position of reserves totalling £485,763. This represents the fixed assets of the charity (as split between restricted and designated funds, Note 8) together with a designated £120,000 reserve for ongoing maintenance and supporting the overdrawn general fund which is in deficit by £101,016. The trustees are fully aware of this deficit which is covered by the £120,000 reserve and are monitoring the situation on a day-to-day basis. They will also be actively involved in the work of Roanne Dods and the organisational development of Cove Park, specifically where it concerns increasing both earned and contributed income.

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2008 (cont)

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities (continued)

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement as to Disclosure of Information to Auditors

So far as the directors as aware, there is no relevant audit information (as defined by Section 234ZA of the Companies Act 1985) of which the charity's auditors are unaware, and each director has taken all the steps that he or she ought to have taken as a director in order to make himself or herself aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information.

Auditors

The auditors, Cook & Co, Chartered Accountants, will be proposed for re-appointment in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985.

Report of the Independent Auditors to the members of Cove Park for the year ended 31 December 2008

We have audited the financial statements of Cove Park and its subsidiary company for the year ended 31 December 2008 on pages 10 to 21 which have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out therein.

In view of the significance of this matter we consider that it should be drawn to your attention but our opinion is not qualified in this respect.

1. Accounting Policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007) and the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities (revised 2005).

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements comprise the audited financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertaking made up to 31 December 2008. The subsidiary is accounted for using acquisition accounting. No goodwill arose on the acquisition of the subsidiary undertaking.

Cashflow statement

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement as it qualifies as a small company.

Incoming resources

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in the financial statements as receivable except as follows:-

- When donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- When donors impose conditions, which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.

When donors specify that donations and grants, including capital grants, be for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable.

Interest receivable

Interest is included when receivable by the charity.

Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories. Certain other costs, which are attributable to more than one activity, are apportioned across cost categories on the basis of an estimate of the proportion of time spent by staff on those activities.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Fixtures & fittings	-	15% on cost
Plant & machinery	-	20% on cost

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

Statement of Financial Activities

For the purpose of the Statement of Financial Activities as shown on page 10, funds are defined as follows:

Unrestricted funds comprise grants and other income received for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Designated funds represent unrestricted funds that have been earmarked by the directors for particular purposes.

Restricted funds comprise grants, donations and other income received for spending on specified purposes as laid down by the donors.

Gifted Assets

All receipts of fixed assets by way of gift are capitalised and included in the balance sheet. The market value of the gifted asset is credited to the unrestricted designated fund, against which depreciation is charged in accordance with the relevant accounting policy.
