### Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2015

The Trustees are pleased to present their Report together with the Consolidated Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2015.

#### Status of Charity and Governing Document

Cove Park ("the Charity") is a company limited by guarantee (No: SC201042, incorporated 26 October 1999) and is therefore governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. It is a registered Scottish charity, reference number: SC029530. The wholly owned subsidiary, Cove Park Enterprises Limited, is a company registered in Scotland (SC200626).

#### **Appointment of Trustees**

New trustees are appointed as and when required by the Charity's needs. Appointment is through a process of criteria that has been agreed upon by the current trustees, and the period of appointment is in accordance with the Articles of Association. New trustees are provided with information which aims to familiarise them with the charity's values, aims and objectives, together with its day to day operations in addition to clarifying their statutory responsibilities as directors of a company limited by guarantee and trustees of a charity.

#### **Administrative Structure**

The trustees meet around three times throughout the year to discuss the operations of the charity, while the day-to-day running of the charity is delegated to Julian Forrester, with the support of the directors.

#### Statement of Risk

The trustees continually review and assess the major strategic, operational and financial risks to which the Charity is exposed. From this review, the trustees continue to update and establish procedures to mitigate those risks which are identified as a result. Main risks that have been identified are:

- Direction and Forward Planning of the Charity
- Control of Charity Assets
- Personnel
- Financial Management & Controls

For each of these risks, procedures have been put in place to mitigate and reduce the associated risk.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2015 (cont)

#### **Charitable Objectives**

The primary aims of the Charity are to advance the education of the public in all aspects of contemporary artistic practice by:

- providing residencies for individuals and collaborating groups which offer them the time, space and freedom to undertake significant research, to make new work and to find new ways of working.
- facilitating collaboration, the exchange of ideas and dialogue among resident artists.
- encouraging participation by the public in the process of making new work by means of events, workshops, special projects and public occasions.

#### Achievements and Performance

2015 was a particularly significant year for Cove Park. We delivered both a full programme of residencies for national and international artists - involving several new elements described below - and began a major capital redevelopment programme in September. Our Artists Centre (which was built in the 1980s for Cove Conservation Park and had become largely inoperable in the winter months and too small to accommodate our expanding programme) was demolished in September. By December, Clark Contracts was midway through construction of a new building designed by Cameron Webster Architects and funded by Creative Scotland, the Monument and Robertson Trusts, amongst other generous private donors, who together contributed the £1.4 million required. The building is scheduled for completion in Spring 2016, bringing with it increased accommodation, studios and new spaces for artists and public activity.

Although without an Artists Centre from September, we were able to run all planned activities during the year. These included funded residencies, taking place between May and October, awarded to the following artists:

#### Other activities

The summer season was enhanced through its peer-to-peer programme of talks, presentations and public events. Glasgow's Project Ability visited Cove Park for the first time to participate in a one-day studio event with Lauren Printy Currie and we hosted our first Portfolio Preparation weekend in collaboration with Comar, Mull. Cove Park's first dedicated Film Residency, for a mid-career filmmaker, was launched in 2015 and will continue in future years. The Edinburgh-based writer Maria Fusco undertook a residency in June, funded by Artangel, to allow her to develop the Artangel Open Commission for BBC Radio 4. Visual artist Alison Turnbull returned to Cove Park to finalise work on the publication 'Another Green World', published by Art Books and launched later in the year at events in Edinburgh and London.

We held two special events in September for our local community. These enabled us to introduce our plans for both the programme and 50-acre site and to capture opinions and comments on our future development. In November, The Paul Hamlyn Foundation committed two-year support for 'Hands-On Cove Park', the new education programme due to launch in July 2016. 'Hands-On' will be managed by a dedicated Programme Producer, appointed in the spring of 2016 and supported by the Robertson Trust.

#### Future plans (continued)

Hands-On

This project is supported by the Hamlyn Foundation and the Robertson Trust to begin in 2016 and run over a two-year period. A community steering group will be formed to advise on the programme.

#### Literature

Resident artists will be Rachel Holmes, biographer of Eleanor Marx; Marion Coutts, author of the The Iceberg; Mikey Cuddihy, author of Summerhill; Lynsey May (emerging Scottish writer); Jessica Fox (storyteller for NASA turned children's historical novel writer); Susan Wicks (distinguished poet and translator). The International Writer will be Yelena Moskovich, a Russian novelist living in Paris.

#### Translation

A number of different countries will be represented in a project to translate Scottish literature of all kinds through both individual and group residencies.

#### Crafts

2016 Emerging Designer/ Maker is Jennifer Kent, a Glasgow based knit designer. Two residencies will go to UK based makers, textile artists Celia Pym and Silversmith Max Warren, and the International Craft residency has been awarded to Dutch architect Erno Langenburg.

#### Capital funds

#### **Financial Review**

The consolidated gross income for the year was £782,710 (2014: £501,898) with £28,895 (2014: £33,193) coming from charitable and trading activities, which arose in the wholly owned subsidiary Cove Park Enterprises Limited. There was a consolidated net surplus for the year of £191,695 (2014: £259,072) and a breakdown of this between the funds is detailed on page 9.

The statement of financial activities on page 9 show a significant non-recurring deficit on the designated assets fund which was due to an impairment provision against the old artists centre. As explained further on page 3, the old artists centre was demolished in September 2015 to allow construction to commence on the new centre. As a result of this a provision was required to reduce the value of the old centre buildings to nil.

The financial statements show a consolidated position of funds totalling £923,749 (2014: £732,054), which is split between restricted and unrestricted funds as detailed further in notes 19 and 20.

At the balance sheet date, there is an accumulated deficit carried forward on the unrestricted general fund of £77,457. The trustees are taking measures to bring the operating finances into balance. These include initiatives to increase income from residences and to increase efficiency in building and site services. Furthermore ongoing funding from Creative Scotland (whom Cove Park has a rolling two year contract), several trusts including Jerwood Charitable Foundation and income earned from revenue generating residencies ensure that the year round programme of work can be developed and delivered.

#### **Statement of Trustees Responsibilities**

The charity trustees (who are also directors of Cove Park for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and the group and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable group for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charitable company's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

We have audited the financial statements of Cove Park for the year ended 31 December 2015 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet, and the related notes. #### Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2015

#### 1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. Assets and liabilities are initially recorded at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

All figures reported in the financial statements are in pounds sterling.

#### Group financial statements

The financial statements consolidate the results of the charity and its wholly owned subsidiary Cove Park Enterprises Limited on a line-by-line basis.

#### Cashflow statement

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement as it qualifies as a small company.

#### Preparation of the accounts on a going concern basis

At the balance sheet date the charity had a deficit on its general fund of £77,457. The directors have carried out a review of the charity, prepared future cash flows and consider that the charity will be able to operate within its agreed facility limits.

#### Incoming resources

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, there is sufficient certainty or receipt and so it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Donations, are recognised when they have been communicated is received in writing with notification of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that those conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Legacy gifts are recognised on a case by case basis following the granting of probate when the administrator/ executor for the estate has communicated in writing both the amount and settlement date. In the event that the gift is in the form of an asset other than cash or a financial asset traded on a recognised stock exchange, recognition is subject to the value of the gift being reliable measurable with a degree of reasonable accuracy and the title to the asset has been transferred to the charity.

#### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenses, including support costs and governance costs, are allocated or apportioned to the applicable expenditure headings in the statement of financial activities.

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2015

#### 1. Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Computer equipment	-	15% on cost
Fixtures & fittings	-	15% on cost
Plant & machinery	-	20% on cost

As noted in the trustees report, the charity began construction of a new artists centre and the costs have been capitalised as assets under construction. As the centre construction was not complete at the balance sheet date, no depreciation has been provided.

#### Stock

Stock is included at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

#### Debtors

Debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

#### Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

#### Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount.

#### Financial Instruments

The charity only has financial assets and liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

#### Fund Structure

Unrestricted income funds comprise those funds which the trustees are free to use for any purpose in furtherance of the charitable objects. Unrestricted funds include designated funds where the trustees, at their discretion, have created a fund for a specific purpose.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donor or trust deed.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in notes 19 and 20.

#### Gifted Assets

All receipts of fixed assets by way of gift are capitalised and included in the balance sheet. The market value of the gifted asset is credited to the unrestricted designated fund, against which depreciation is charged in accordance with the relevant accounting policy.
