Directors' Report

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year to 31 January 2009.

Business review and activities

The Company's principal activity is as a holding company of a management company whose principal activity is private equity fund management. Two wholly owned subsidiaries of the Company are the General Partner companies of the third party funds. The manager of these funds is Alliance Trust Equity Partners Limited. During the year, two of the partnerships managed by the General Partner Albany Ventures GP1 Limited were terminated following the sale of the last investment in their portfolio.

Results and dividends

The loss for the period after taxation was £619 (£146,772).

Auditor

Notes to the Financial Statements Year ended 31 January 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding period.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards.

Consolidated accounts

The Company is exempt under section 228 of the Companies Act 1985 from the requirement to prepare consolidated accounts because the Company and its subsidiaries are consolidated in the Group accounts of the ultimate Parent Company, Alliance Trust PLC. Information in these financial statements is therefore presented for the individual Company and not the group.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment.

Depreciation is provided on cost in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The rate of depreciation is as follows:

Investments

Investments are shown at cost.

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for services provided in the normal course of business net of VAT. Services comprise the recharge of costs incurred on behalf of Alliance Trust Equity Partners Limited.

Interest

Interest received is accounted for on an accruals basis as are other income and expenses.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised at the standard rate of corporation tax, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed out by the balance sheet date. To the extent that timing differences will not be utilised, then deferred tax assets are not recognised.

Cash flow

The Company is exempt under the terms of 'FRS 1 (Revised 1996) Cash Flow Statements' from the requirement to publish its own cash flow statement, as its cash flows are included within the consolidated cash flow statement of the Group.
