REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors present their report together with financial statements for the period ended 31 January 2002.

Principal activities

The company is principally engaged in municipal, commercial and industrial waste collection and recycling. The company also provides other land management and recycling services.

Business review

The company was incorporated on the 2nd August 2000 under the name of Dunwilco (808) Ltd, this was changed to GM Waste Management Ltd on the 7th March 2000 and subsequently changed to Eden Waste Recycling Ltd on the 6th September 2001.

There was a loss for the period after taxation amounting to £54,187. The directors do not recommend payment of a dividend.

Directors

The present membership of the Board is set out below. The directors were all appointed during the period. In addition M B Polson and D J Crawford were appointed directors on the 2nd August 2000 and resigned on the 7th September 2001. S Tahir was appointed a director on the 7th September 2001 and resigned as director on the 5th November 2001.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost convention.

The principal accounting policies of the company are set out below.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of all tangible fixed assets other than freehold land by equal annual instalments over their expected useful lives. The rates generally applicable are:

Motor vehicles 33.33% Fixtures and fittings 33.33%

DEFERRED TAXATION

Deferred tax is recognised on all timing differences where the transactions or events that give the company an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future, have occurred by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised when it is more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax is measured using rates of tax that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO PENSION FUNDS

Defined benefit scheme

The pension costs charged against profits are based on actuarial methods and assumptions designed to spread the anticipated pension costs over the service lives of the employees in the scheme, so as to ensure that the regular pension cost represents a substantially level percentage of the current and expected future pensionable payroll. Variations from regular cost are spread over the average remaining service lives of current employees in the scheme.

LEASED ASSETS

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised in the balance sheet and depreciated over their expected useful lives. The interest element of leasing payments represents a constant proportion of the capital balance outstanding and is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease.

15 ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING AND CONTROLLING RELATED PARTY

The company's parent company is Murray Group Management Limited by virtue of its 100% shareholding in the company. The ultimate controlling related party is Murray International Holdings Limited as a result of its controlling interest in Murray Group Management Limited.

The directors consider that the ultimate controlling party of this company is Mr D E Murray by virtue of his controlling interest in the ultimate controlling undertaking Murray International Holdings Limited.

The largest group of undertakings for which group accounts have been drawn up is that headed by Murray International Holdings Limited.
